## City of Brampton Transportation Master Plan

The City of Brampton has completed an update of its Transportation Master Plan (TMP). The TMP update study has followed the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) process, which is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. The TMP incorporates comments received from the public and agencies during the course of the study.

The TMP provides a "blueprint" to guide planning and decision-making to achieve a balanced transportation system that meets Brampton's growth and development needs over the long term. The TMP makes strategic recommendations for a sustainable, safe, and efficient multi-modal city-wide network, addressing roads, transit, active transportation (e.g., walking and cycling), goods movement, and transportation demand management.

The 2015 Transportation Master Plan sets a vision for how people and goods will move within and through the city from now until the year 2041, and places a strong emphasis on transit, cycling, walking and carpooling. Roadway extensions, widenings and new road construction projects have also been identified in order to facilitate movement to all parts of the city. More detailed studies for road projects, included in the TMP, will be completed at a later date as per the Municipal Class EA process, and will require additional public consultation and development of design options.

The TMP is closely aligned with other City transportationrelated studies, including the recent Development Charges By-law update, and will also provide an input to the ongoing Official Plan Review. Brampton City Council approved the draft Transportation Master Plan in principle on July 8, 2015, pending the 30-day public review period that commences with issuance of this Notice.

The Transportation Master Plan is available for public viewing at the Clerk's Department, Brampton City Hall, located at 2 Wellington Street West, Monday to Friday, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm or online at www.brampton.ca/tmp2014. The report will be available for review for 30 days.

Please provide your comments, in writing, to the City of Brampton by **Wednesday, October 30** (30 calendar days from posting of notice), 2015. After this date, the Transportation Master Plan will be finalized, taking into consideration the comments received from the public. The TMP report is available on the project website.
