

Accessible Parking Permits

Where is parking permitted?

Vehicles displaying a valid Accessible Parking Permit may park:

In areas where the following signs are posted:

- No Parking or Parking Prohibited (Section 42 (12))
- No Parking Times as posted (Section 49)

City Wide:

- Parking Facing the Wrong Way (Section 40 (1))
- No Parking 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. (Section 42 (11))

In any space designated and signed for permit use only.

Free at parking meters on City streets (Section 56 (4))

Displaying Your Accessible Parking Permit

Only the original permit must be displayed. Photocopies are not acceptable substitutes.

The City will recognize Accessible Parking Permits issued by all Provinces in Canada, the United States and Europe. To be accepted, permits must have an expiry date and serial number.

Permits must be placed in a visible area of your windshield. The expiry date and serial number must be visible from the outside. If either of these are obscured a parking ticket can be issued.

The Accessible Parking Permit is issued to an individual and can be moved from vehicle to vehicle.

Where is parking prohibited?

Parking is prohibited:

In areas where the following signs are posted:

- Designated Fire Routes (Section 47 (5))
- No Stopping (Section 43 (2))
- No Stopping Times as Posted (Section 50)
