# **BY-LAW**

To restrict vehicle loads to 5,000 kilograms per axle on certain highways

WHEREAS subsection 7 of section 104 of <u>The Highway Traffic Act</u> (R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 198, as amended) provides that the municipal corporation or other authority having jurisdiction over a highway may by by-law designate the date on which a reduced load period shall start or end and the highway or portion thereof under its jurisdiction to which the designation applies.

AND WHEREAS restriction of loads is deemed necessary for the protection of certain highways in the City of Brampton;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. No commercial motor vehicle or trailer, other than a public vehicle or a two axle tank-truck or a two axle truck, while either is used as referred to in subsection 104a (1) of <u>The Highway Traffic Act</u>, shall be operated or drawn on the highways set out in Column 1 of Schedule I to this by-law between the limits set out in Column 2 of the said schedule, when appropriate signs have been erected, where any axle of such commercial motor vehicle or trailer transmits to the highway a weight in excess of 5,000 kilograms.
- 2. (1) Section 1 of this by-law does not apply to prevent the operation of a commercial motor vehicle or trailer on the parts of the highways described in Schedule A where a special permit has been applied for and obtained from the Commissioner of Public Works for the City.
  - (2) A special permit may be made subject to such terms and conditions as the Commissioner of Public Works deems appropriate.
- 3. The provisions of section 106 of <u>The Highway Traffic Act</u> shall apply to contraventions of section 1 of this by-law.
- 4. Any person who operates or draws a commercial motor vehicle or trailer in contravention of the terms and conditions a special permit issued pursuant to section 2 of this by-law is guilty of an offence and is liable, upon conviction, to a penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), exclusive of costs.

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5. Where there is any conflict between the provisions of this by-law and the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act, the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act shall prevail.

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- 6. By-law 222-80 and all amendments pertaining thereto of the City of Brampton be and the same are hereby repealed.
- 7. This by-law shall not become effective until approved by the Council of The Regional Municipality of Peel.
