**A By-law to allow for a transition period
in relation to the expiry of By-law 92-96, as amended,
To provide for the Registration of Two-Unit Houses
(Accessory/Basement Apartments)**

WHEREAS the Council for The Corporation of the City of Brampton passed By-law 31-2006 to provide that By-law 92-96, as amended, expires on January 31, 2006;


AND WHEREAS the Council for The Corporation of the City of Brampton desires to provide for a transition period for applications pursuant to By-law 92-96, as amended, that were received by the City of Brampton prior to January 31, 2006;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton hereby ENACTS as follows:

1. Notwithstanding By-law 31-2006, the expiry of By-law 92-96, as amended, shall be deemed not to apply to any complete applications pursuant to By-law 92-96, as amended, that were received by the City of Brampton prior to January 31, 2006.
2. Notwithstanding section 1 of this By-law, any complete applications pursuant to By-law 92-96, as amended, that were received prior to January 1, 2005, and for which the City has no record of activity from the applicant after January 1, 2005, are hereby deemed abandoned such that the transition period in section 1 of this By-law does not apply.
3. The transition period provided for under section 1 of this By-law shall expire on July 15, 2006, subject to the right of the Commissioner of Planning, Design and Development Services to extend the transition period for up to ninety (90) days on a case-by-case basis where in the opinion of the Commissioner hardship would otherwise result.


