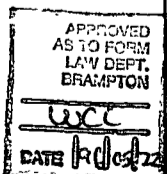


To stop up and close and
authorize the lease of part
of Queen Street West

The Council of The Corporation of the City of
Brampton **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. The part of the public highway known as Queen Street West, being composed of part of the original road allowance between Lots 5 and 6, Concession 1 West of Hurontario Street, and part of Lots 21 and 22, Block 2, Plan BR-4, established as part of the public highway system by By-law 179-95 registered as Instrument No. RO1100712, designated as Part 1 on Reference Plan 43R-21596, as hereby stopped up and closed.
2. The lease of the said lands to 850333 Ontario Inc. operating as Fanzorelli's, for a term of four months commencing June 1, 1996, at a rate of \$150.00 plus G.S.T. per month, is hereby authorized. The lease shall provide for an option to renew upon the same terms for the years 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2000.
3. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute all documents approved by the City Solicitor that in his opinion are necessary to effect the transaction authorized by this by-law.
4. The affidavit of Leonard J. Mikulich attached as Schedule A forms part of this by-law.
