BY-LAW

To declare surplus and authorize the sale of certain lands to Maritime Life Assurance Company

The Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

- The lands described in Schedule A to this by-law are hereby declared surplus. The transfer of the said lands to Maritime Life Assurance Company for the price of \$200,000 is hereby authorized.
- 2. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute, in a form approved by the City Solicitor, a use and occupancy agreement between Maritime Life Assurance Company and The Corporation of the City of Brampton and all other documents approved by the City Solicitor respecting the continuation of the operations of Brampton Transit on the said lands.
- 3. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute all documents approved by the City Solicitor that in his opinion are necessary to effect the transfer of the lands as authorized by this by-law.

SCHEDULE A to By-law 99-96

The land situated in the City of Brampton, Regional Municipality of Peel (formerly Town of Brampton, County of Peel) being part of the East Half of Lot 6, Concession 1 West of Hurontario Street, Lot 83 and part of Lot 82 fronting on Hurontario Street, now known as Main Street North, Lot N fronting on George Street North, Lot 82, part of Lots 80 and 81 fronting on Nelson Street West according to a plan of the East Half of Lot 6, Concession 1 West of Hurontario Street referred to as BR-4 designated as Parts 1 to 14, and 17 to 22, both inclusive, according to Reference Plan 43R-18369.
