THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON

BY-LAW NUMBER 102-74

A By-law to regulate and prohibit the discharge of firearms within the City of Brampton.

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton deem it expedient to enact certain regulations in the discharge of firearms in the City of Brampton;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

- 1) For the purpose of this By-law the following definitions shall apply:
 - a) "Owner" shall include a lessee or a bona fide employee of the owner or lessee of the premises in question or a child over the age of 16 years of such owner or lessee or any person with the written consent of the owner on the said premises.
 - b) "Gun" shall include any firearm, airgun, pellet gun or spring-gun of any class or type.
 - c) "Agriculture" shall mean lands zoned Agriculture in accordance with City Restricted Area By-laws.
- 2) No person shall discharge any gun or any firearm within the limits of the City of Brampton.
- 3) Notwithstanding clause 2 of the following exceptions shall apply:
 - i) An owner of premises situated in the City of Brampton which are zoned for Agriculture and actually used for Agricultural purposes may discharge a gun which is not larger than a .22 calibre rifle, or a 12 guage shot gun, upon his premises.
 - ii) Lands known as the East Half of Lot 11, Concession 2-E.H.S. may be used for the discharge of guns or firearms in conjunction with the use of the lands as a shooting range, shooting gallery or skeet shooting range provided same is undertaken with the consent of the property owner.

- May by resolution give consent to an organized hunt or a firearm competition, or turkey shoot where Council are satisfied with the supervision and organization of the proposed hunt and where the consent of the owner of the land has been obtained.
- Nothing in this By-law shall relieve any person from complying with the Game & Fisheries Act or the Hunting regulations of The Department of Lands & Forests of the Province of Ontario or the Migratory Birds Convention Act of the Dominion of Canada.
- 6. Nothing in this By-law is intended to prohibit the use of guns by any Policemen, Guards, Servicemen or other Peace Officers authorized to use guns by any Provincial, Federal or Municipal Act.
- 7. Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-law is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding the sum of \$1000.00 for each offence exclusive of costs.
