The Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

- By-law 317-81, being a by-law to authorize certain off street parking of vehicles operated by or conveying physically handicapped persons, is hereby further amended;
 - (1) by adding to section (1) subsection (vi) of Part I the words "which sign shall display the fine amount".
 - (2) by adding to section (5) of Part II, the following as subsection (d):
 - "(d) display the fine amount in letters that shall be a minimum of one (1) inch in height."
 - (3) by deleting any reference made to "By-law 33-79, as amended" in section 1 subsection (ii)(iii)(iv) and (vii) of Part 1 and section 1 of Part 2 and the words "By-law 193-83, as amended" are substituted therefor.



- 2. Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of Part 8 of By-law 317-81 are hereby repealed and the following sections are substituted therefor:
 - in the interval of the subject to a penalty of not more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00).
 - Where a vehicle is found parked in contravention of the provisions of this by-law, the enforcing official may issue a summons or issue and attach to or place on the vehicle a ticket in the form of a serially numbered notice stating:
 - (a) the licence number and concise description of the vehicle;
 - (b) that the vehicle is unlawfully parked;
 - (c) the date, time and place of the alleged offence;
 - (d) that the owner or driver thereof may make a voluntary payment of Fifty Dolars (\$50.00) to The Corporation of the City of Brampton, by attendance at its office between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, or by mail thereto, within five (5) days after the day when the ticket was issued; and
 - (e) that in the event of a failure to make such payment, a summons will be issued pursuant to the <u>Summary Convictions Act.</u>"

- 3. Section 1 of Part 4 of By-law 317-81 is hereby repealed.
- 4. By-law 94-87 is hereby repealed.
