WHEREAS the City of Brampton deems it desirable that a certain part of James Street, more particularly described on Schedule 'A' annexed hereto and forming part of this By-law (herein called the Street) be stopped up, closed and sold to the owner of abutting property because of the existence of an encroachment of the building constructed on the abutting lands onto the street;

AND WHEREAS the City of Brampton has assumed the said Street as a public highway;

AND WHEREAS notice of this By-law has been published at least once a week for four (4) successive weeks in the Daily Times and the Guardian;

AND WHEREAS the Council or a Committee of Council has heard in person or by his counsel, solicitor, agent or any person who claims that his land will be prejudicially affected by this By-law and who applied to be heard.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

- 1. That the Street be and the same is hereby stopped up and closed.
- 2. That the stopped up and closed Street be sold to the owner of the abutting land and the price at which it is to be sold shall be fixed at the sum of \$2.00 together with all costs associated with the closing.

3. That the Mayor and the Clerk are authorized to execute any documents which may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this By-law.
