



THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON

BY-LAW

Number 133-82
To temporarily close portions of
Queen Street and Bramalea Road
for a period of time on Sunday,
August 1, 1982.

WHEREAS paragraph 1 of Section 235 of the Municipal Act (R.S.O. 1980, chapter 302, as amended) authorizes Council to pass by-laws for regulating parades or processions on highways;

AND WHEREAS the Board of Directors of the Pine and Rose Festival have requested permission to hold a parade along portions of Queen Street and Bramalea Road in the City of Brampton on the 1st day of August, 1982;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:


1. That during the passing of the Pine and Rose Festival Parade to be held on the 1st day of August, 1982, the following streets shall be closed to vehicular traffic between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.:


(I) Queen Street from McMurphy Avenue to Bramalea Road; and

(II) Bramalea Road from Queen Street to Central Park Drive.

2. That on the 1st day of August, 1982, from 9:30 a.m. and during the passing of the said parade, parking on Queen Street from McMurchy Avenue to Union Street shall be prohibited.
3. That the Peel Regional Police be requested to take the necessary steps to control traffic during the passing of the parade.

READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD TIME and PASSED in Open Council this 12th day of July, 1982.


