

## THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON

## **BY-LAW**

WHEREAS Council for the City of Brampton supports good waste reduction practices and the improvement of the environment;

AND WHEREAS for this purpose, Council wishes to establish a Brampton Clean City Committee (BCCC);

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. There shall be a sub-committee of the Community Services Committee to be known as the Brampton Clean City Committee, to be appointed by Council, and it shall be composed of the following:
  - (a) Seven (7) persons who are qualified electors but are not members of City Council or Regional Council or a local Board as defined in s.1 of the Municipal Affairs Act;
  - (b) One Municipal Council Member;
  - (c) One Regional Council Member;
  - (d) One employee of the City of Brampton Parks Operations & Maintenance Division who shall be a non-voting member;
  - (e) One employee of the Region of Peel Residential Waste Reduction Dept. who shall be a non-voting member.
- 2. The first term of appointment shall end on December 31, 1997.
- 3. After December 31, 1997, each term of appointment shall be for a period of two full calendar years.
- 4. At the first meeting in January of each year, the BCCC shall elect a Chairperson, a vice-Chairperson, and a Treasurer.
- 5. Notwithstanding the foregoing, there shall be appointed by Council a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson who shall hold such positions until December 31, 1997.
- 6. The BCCC shall prepare separate annual estimates of programs and funds required to support its programs and shall submit its estimates in January of each

year and shall make such further information and representation as Council may require in its consideration of those programs and estimates.

- 7. The aims and objectives of the BCCC shall be as follows:
  - (a) To create the opportunity for citizens to help the environment,
  - (b) To build community pride and a sense of ownership in the City's parkland,
  - (c) To share the responsibility for a clean community with the citizens, and
  - (d) To develop opportunities for youth to learn about the environment.
