The Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Part of Creditview Road, established by By-law 1-89, designated as Parts 2, 3, 4 and 5 on Schedule A attached hereto, is hereby stopped up and closed and authorized for sale to the adjacent property owner at a cost of \$2.30 per square foot, exclusive of survey and advertising costs.
- 2. The sale, to the adjacent property owner, of part of the West Half of Lot 12, Concession 3 West of Hurontario Street, designated as Part 6 on Schedule A attached hereto, at a purchase price of \$2.30 per square foot, exclusive of survey and advertising costs, is hereby authorized.
- 3. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute all documents approved by the City Solicitor that in his opinion are necessary to effect the transfer of the said lands.
- 4. The affidavit of Kathryn Zammit attached as Schedule B forms part of this by-law.


