## **BY-LAW**

A By-law to amend Procedure By-law 160-2004, as amended, to include revise
provisions for filing a Notice of Motion during a meeting and to prescribe
provisions for giving public notice for heritage designations under Sections IV
and V of the Ontario Heritage Act

WHEREAS By-law 160-2004 was passed pursuant to the *Municipal Act, 2001*, s. 238 (2) to govern the calling, place and proceedings of meetings;

AND WHEREAS the *Ontario Heritage Act*, s. 26 (4) and 39.1(3) permit a municipality to adopt alternative public notice provisions in accordance with the *Municipal Act*, 2001 as an alternative to publication of a notice in a newspaper;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to Council Resolutions C177-2009 and C178-2009, approved by Council on June 24, 2009, it is deemed appropriate to amend Bylaw 160-2004, as amended;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

That By-law-160-2004 is hereby further amended as follows:

- 1. Section 4.10 is hereby amended to add the following:
  - (3) Notwithstanding subsections (1) and (2) above, a Notice of Motion may be added to an agenda with a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote provided the motion is to be dealt with at a subsequent meeting.
- 2. Section 1 of Schedule A to By-law 160-2004 titled "Public Notice Provisions and Methods" is hereby further amended by adding the following:

## Heritage Designations

heritage designations under Parts IV and V of the Ontario Heritage
Act (public notice by web site posting only)
