BY-LAW

Number 224-2000

To declare surplus and authorize the execution of a property purchase agreement with Her Majesty the Queen in Right of the Province of Ontario

The Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton has determined that it is appropriate and in the interest of The Corporation of the City of Brampton to transfer the lands described in this by-law to Her Majesty the Queen in Right of the Province of Ontario represented by the Minister of Transportation for the Province of Ontario to facilitate the construction of an interchange at Sandalwood Parkway and the future extension of Highway 410.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. The land described in Schedule A to this by-law is hereby declared to be surplus.
2. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a property purchase agreement between The Corporation of the City of Brampton and Her Majesty the Queen in Right of the Province of Ontario represented by the Minister of Transportation for the Province of Ontario, pursuant to which The Corporation of the City of Brampton agrees to transfer the land described in Schedule A to this by-law for the price of \$2.00.
3. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute all transfers and other document approved by the City Solicitor that in his opinion are necessary to effect the transfer of the land described in Schedule A to this by-law.
