in respect of parking of trailers and large vehicles, and to repeal and replace By-law 195-84

The Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:** 

By-law 861, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding to Section 12 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), the following subsection:

## PARKING OF TRAILERS AND LARGE VEHICLES

For the purposes of this subsection,

CATERING TRUCK shall mean a truck cab and frame with a catering box installed thereon, having a vehicle weight not in excess of 3300 kilograms, from which various beverages, foods and sundries are sold at various locations;

LARGE MOTOR VEHICLE shall mean any motor vehicle having a vehicle weight greater than 2500 kilograms and an overall height greater than 2.3 metres;

MOTOR VEHICLE includes an automobile, truck, bus, self-propelled mobile home, motorcycle, motorassisted bicycle, snowmobile, and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power;

<u>VEHICLE WEIGHT</u> shall mean the weight of the vehicle itself, as set out in the manufacturers specifications.

(2) A person shall not park or store, or permit to be parked or stored, on any lot the use of which is restricted to residential purposes, any big motor vehicle, other than a catering truck, unless it is at the time being used to make a delivery or provide a service.

- (b) A person shall not park or store, or permit to be parked or stored, on any lot the use of which is restricted to residential purposes, any large motor vehicle, unless it is parked or stored within a totally enclosed building or structure, or unless it is being used at the time to make a delivery or provide a service.
- (3) (a) Except as permitted by Paragraph 3(b) of this subsection, a person shall not park or store, or permit to be parked or stored, any truck, trailer, mobile home, house trailer, travel trailer, or any other type of trailer, in an exterior side yard or in the front yard, including the part of the driveway therein, of any lot in a residential zone.
  - (b) A travel trailer not exceeding 5 metres in length when closed may be parked or stored in the part of the driveway that is in the front yard."
- 2. By-law 195-84 is hereby repealed.
