

BY-LAW NUMBER 262-75

Prohibiting Heavy Traffic on Certain  
Highways.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 354, Subsection 1, Paragraph 107 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1970, Chapter 284, The Councils of Local Municipalities may pass By-laws prohibiting Heavy Traffic on Highways.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton deems it expedient to prohibit Heavy Traffic on certain Highways.


NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:-


1. In this By-law "Heavy Truck" means a commercial motor vehicle having a weight when unloaded of three tons or more or, when loaded of five tons or more but does not include ambulances, buses, fire apparatus, vehicles owned by, or operated for the City of Brampton, or any privately owned vehicles driven to or from the owners residence.
2. In this By-law "Commercial Motor Vehicle" means a motor vehicle having permanently attached thereto, a truck or delivery body and includes ambulances, hearses, casket wagons, fire apparatus, buses and tractors used for hauling purposes on the Highway.
3. Except as provided in Section 4, when authorized signs to that effect are displayed, no person shall move, drive or operate a Heavy Truck as defined in Section 1 on the Highways set out in Column 1 of Schedule "A" to this By-law between the limits set out in Column 2 of the said Schedule during the times or days set out in Column 3 of the said schedule.
4. Section 3 shall not apply to any vehicle actually engaged in making delivery to or a collection from premises which

cannot be reached except by way of a highway or a portion of highway referred to in the said section, or to prohibit the use of such vehicles, for such purposes, provided that in making such delivery or collection the said Highway or portion of Highway is travelled only insofar as is unavoidable in getting to and from such premises.

5. Any persons violating any of the provisions of this By-law shall be subject to a penalty of not more than ten dollars (\$10.00) for the first offence and not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) for every subsequent offence, exclusive of costs and all such penalties shall be recoverable under The Ontario Summary Convictions Act.
  
6. This By-law shall not become effective until approved by the Regional Municipality of Peel.

READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD TIME and passed in Open Council this 8th day of December, 1975.
