# BY-LAW

Number 319-2009

A By-law to Amend Traffic By-law 93-93,  
to make housekeeping amendments with respect to the conformance to  
traffic signs, blocking of accessible parking aisles and unlicensed vehicles

---

WHEREAS Subsection 11(3) of the *Municipal Act, 2001* permits a local municipality to pass by-laws respecting highways, including parking and traffic on highways;

AND WHEREAS the Corporation of the City of Brampton wishes to make a number of housekeeping amendments with respect to traffic signs, accessible parking and unlicensed vehicles;

The Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

1. By-law 93-93, as amended, is hereby and further amended as follows:

- (1) By deleting Section 22 (2) from the Traffic By-law 93-93;
- (2) By inserting the following section:

### **Traffic Signs**

20.1 Every driver or operator of a vehicle shall obey the instructions or directions indicated on any sign erected in accordance with the schedules of this by-law.

- (3) Section 48 (3) of the Traffic By-law 93-93 is replaced by the following:


### **No Blocking of Access Aisle**


48 (3) No person, including persons driving a vehicle displaying an accessible parking permit, shall park on or behind an access aisle.

- (4) Section 55 of the Traffic By-law 93-93 is replaced by the following:

55. (1) No person shall park a motor vehicle on a highway or on municipal property unless:
- (a) there exists a currently validated permit for the vehicle issued pursuant to the *Highway Traffic Act* and its regulations;
  - (b) number plates issued in accordance with the *Highway Traffic Act* and its regulations are displayed on the vehicle in the manner prescribed by the *Highway Traffic Act* and its regulations; and
  - (c) evidence of the current validation of the permit is affixed to one of the number plates or to the rear mini-plate, if applicable, in the manner prescribed by the *Highway Traffic Act* and its regulations.
- (2) No person shall park an immobile motor vehicle on a highway or on municipal property.
