

Notice of Intention to Amend Sign By-law 399-2002 Electronic Signs for School Properties

Pursuant to Procedure By-Law 160-2004, as amended, take notice that the Corporation of the City of Brampton intends to consider a site-specific amendment to the Sign By-law 399-2002, as amended.

On **Monday, April 25, 2016 at 1:00 pm** in the Council Chambers, City Hall, the Planning & Infrastructure Services Committee will consider permitting “electronic variable message centres” on ground signs for school properties.

The Sign By-law currently permits electronic messaging provided the ground sign is separated from residential properties by at least 36 metres. As schools are primarily located in residential neighbourhoods, it is not possible to meet this requirement.

The proposed amendment, requested by the Peel District School Board, will permit electronic variable message centres on ground signs for school properties provided the electronic portion of the sign is turned off between 10:00 pm and 7:00 am.
