

Citizen Appointments to Advisory Committees of Council

The City of Brampton is seeking applications from citizens interested in being appointed to citizen advisory committees for the remainder of this term of Council, ending in November 2018, or until a successor is appointed.

NEW COMMITTEE: Age Friendly Brampton Advisory Committee

This newly-formed committee will advise Council on the achievement of an "age friendly" City, including outdoor spaces, buildings, transportation, housing, respect and social inclusion. It will consist of 19 members including six citizen representatives (three who are older adults (55+) and three who are aged 15-24). (Organizations such as United Way of Peel Region, Sheridan College, and Brampton Multicultural Youth Council will be invited to name stakeholder representatives.) The committee will develop and implement an Age Friendly City Strategy.

Brampton School Traffic Safety Committee (up to two citizen members required)

This committee considers student safety around elementary and secondary schools, and educates the community on these matters. It also reviews school crossing guard locations for kindergarten to grade 5.

Brampton Heritage Board (up to three citizen members required)

The Heritage Board advises Council on the identification, conservation and promotion of resources that are of cultural heritage value or interest. These resources include buildings, streetscapes, districts and cemeteries.

Various Committees (up to five positions)

Applications are invited for these positions to allow the City to be prepared for any committee vacancies that may arise. When applying, applicants are invited to indicate a committee preference(s). When a specific vacancy arises and is to be filled, the applicants will be considered, based on stated preference and available positions.

Qualifications:

Applicants must be qualified electors in the City of Brampton. (See exception above for Age Friendly Advisory Committee.) NOTE: All of these committees require time not only to attend meetings but also to conduct research, participate in site inspections, or to work on sub-committees.

Please submit your application form and resume to the City Clerk's Office no later than 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, February 2, 2017.

Qualified applicants will be contacted individually regarding an interview date and time. Some appointments are subject to a police criminal background check.
