Heritage Heights Subwatershed Study and Landscape Scale Analysis (LSA) Update

THE STUDY:

The City of Brampton, working cooperatively with the Region of Peel and Credit Valley Conservation, has initiated the preparation of a Subwatershed Study and Landscape Scale Analysis Update as input into the planning of a new community referred to as Heritage Heights. Heritage Heights is located west of Mississauga Road, north of the Credit River Valley, south of Mayfield Road and east of Winston Churchill Boulevard (see Key Plan).

The Subwatershed Study and Landscape Scale Analysis Update are proactive documents created cooperatively with public agencies and the community to manage the water, land/water interactions, aquatic life and aquatic resources with subwatershed systems to protect the health of the ecosystem, as land uses change. The Subwatershed Study and Landscape Scale Analysis Update will propose strategies on how best to manage potential impacts on water resources and natural heritage systems, in the context of land use planning documents such as, the Official Plan and Secondary Plan as well as related infrastructure initiatives. It will also recommend strategies for implementing subwatershed initiatives and specify which party is responsible for restoration efforts outside of the municipal planning process.

THE PROCESS:

The study will be completed using a three-phase approach:

- Phase 1: Subwatershed Characterization & Integration
- Phase 2: Subwatershed Impact Analysis
- Phase 3: Management Strategies & Implementation

PUBLIC CONSULTATION:

A Public Information Centre (PIC) will be held at the end of each phase (3 in total).

The study team has completed **Phase 1: Subwatershed Characterization and Integration** and will present the findings at the first Public Information Centre that has been scheduled for:

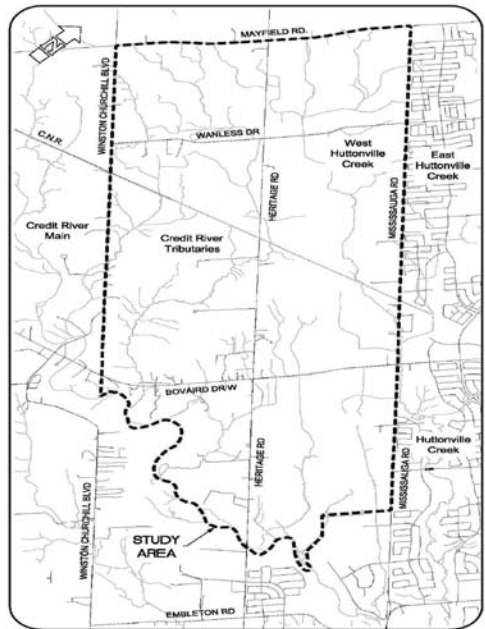
COMMENTS INVITED:
