Highway 427 Industrial Secondary Plan (Area 47) Transportation Master Plan

THE STUDY

The City of Brampton is undertaking a *Transportation Master Plan* as a supporting study for the Highway 427 Industrial Secondary Plan (Area 47). Key objectives of the *Transportation Master Plan* include:

- Identifying the transportation network and policies required to support the planned development of Area 47 in coordination with land use planning within the study area (see key map below).
- Developing and assessing alternative planning options and identifying an optimum transportation system that supports provincial, regional, municipal and inter-municipal planning goals.

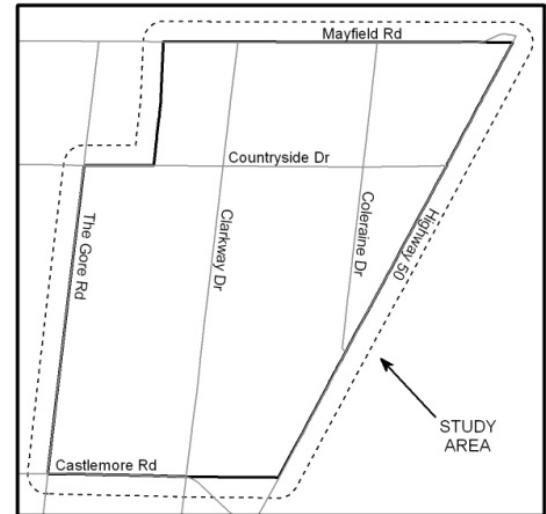
THE PROCESS

The transportation study is being conducted as a Transportation Master Plan in accordance with Phases 1 and 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) process (2000, as amended in 2011). The study will assess the overall impact of transportation improvements on the natural, social, cultural and economic environments as well as address technical criteria. The study will consider input from area residents, local businesses, regulatory agencies and the general public in selecting the preferred solution.
