

Public Consultation Notice

The *Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005* is provincial legislation aimed at making Ontario accessible by 2025. The Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation, O Reg. 191/11, is part of this legislation and Section 79 of the Regulation establishes requirements for municipalities to consult with people with disabilities regarding the need for on-demand accessible taxicabs in their communities and to identify steps towards meeting this need in their accessibility plans.

An accessible taxicab is a vehicle that can safely and comfortably transport a passenger with a disability that requires them to remain seated in a mobility device for the trip. On-demand refers to taxicabs being available on request in the same way as someone who does not require an accessible taxicab would be able to do, for example by telephone or by hailing one of the street. There are currently 13 accessible licensed taxicabs operating in the City of Brampton.
