The recently announced Ryerson University campus in downtown Brampton will become an agent of change and innovation for the city. How will you support the City and other partners in developing skilled workforce of tomorrow, growing the University, and promoting business innovation? City of Brampton is looking into the future. Together with other partners we are developing proposals for a National Centre for Cybersecurity - a place where learning, research, public safety and business come together to achieve excellence and innovation in cybersecurity. How will you support and advocate for the proposed National Centre for Cybersecurity in Brampton? **HEALTH PARTNERSHIPS** Current patient volume numbers and funding analysis at Peel Memorial Centre show significant pressure on existing health care facilities in Brampton, resulting in long wait times and bed shortages. How will you address the funding shortage to meet the current patient volumes, reflect the cost of delivering high quality care, and keep pace with future growth? **REGIONAL GOVERNANCE** City of Brampton is the second fastest growing municipality in Canada. Yet, only 6 out of 10 Brampton Councillors (and Mayor) sit at the Regional Council, each representing 98,939 Brampton residents compared to Mississauga and Caledon representing 72,159 and 16,625 respectively. How will you ensure that Brampton is fairly and adequately represented at the Regional Council?
