5 VOTING MUST KNOWS

Who can vote?

To vote, you must be a Canadian citizen residing in Brampton and at least 18 years old on Voting Day. If you do not live here, but you or your spouse owns or rents property in Brampton, you may still be able to vote.

How do I get on the Voters' List?

The Voters' List is put together for each municipal election based on information held by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC). The Voters' List will be available in early September 2018. You will be able to visit www.brampton.ca/bramptonvotes to check if you are on the Voters' List, and to learn more about how to add yourself to the list.

Where can I vote?

We're making it easier for you to have your voice heard. On October 22, you can vote at any of the voting locations within your ward. A full list of locations will be available closer to Voting Day on www.brampton.ca/bramptonvotes.

Can't make it on Voting Day?

If Voting Day is not convenient for you, consider Advance Voting, October 2, 3, 4, 6, 9, 10, 11, 13. Still can't make it? You can appoint another eligible Brampton voter to vote on your behalf through **proxy voting**. Your designated proxy voter must submit a proxy application form at Brampton City Hall. Information will be available on www.brampton.ca/bramptonvotes.

What should I bring on Voting Day?

Bring your Voter Notice (if you received one in the mail), and a piece of identification that shows your name and Brampton address, such as: an Ontario Driver's Licence or a utility bill. A full list of acceptable documents for identification is available on www.brampton.ca/bramptonvotes.
