Alain Normand, Manager, Emergency Measures, Fire and Emergency Services provided and overview with respect to large crowd event safety plans and protocols within the City of Brampton, which included corporate events, private events, safety plans, special circumstances and the standard operating guideline.












City Centre – Area of Origin for fires






City Centre – Ignition Source of Fires






City Centre – Cause of fire






City Centre – Property type for fire incidents








City Centre – Building Stock






City Centre – Combined household income




City Centre – Employment Stats






City Centre – Transportation to work






City Centre – Age Demographics






City Centre – Minority demographics






City Centre – Minority statistics






City Centre – Religion






City Centre – immigration place of birth






