NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION Bramalea Road Improvements from Queen Street East to South City Limit Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study

The City of Brampton has completed a Schedule 'C' Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) Study for improvements to Bramalea Road from Queen Street East to the south City limit (see map).

The EA study evaluated traffic, transit and active transportation safety and operational improvements, land use implications, natural environment impacts and mitigation measures to select the recommended design.

The Process

The study was completed in accordance with the requirements of Schedule 'C' projects as outlined in the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015), which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

Environmental Study Report

An Environmental Study Report (ESR) has been prepared as part of this study. The ESR summarizes the study process and recommendations and is available for public review on the City's website for 30 calendar days starting May 18, 2023 to June 16, 2023.

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In addition, a request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (i.e., requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (e.g., require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate, or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requester contact information and full name for the ministry.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for additional conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate, or remedy those potential adverse impacts, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request. The request should be sent in writing or by email to the City of Brampton and to:
