Proposal

City for an extended period of time. This proposal only applies to Part One: The General Plan of the City's Official Plan while Part Two: Secondary Plans is not part of the current review.

The City of Brampton Official Plan establishes goals, objectives and policies to guide the overall physical development of the

The policy framework of the current Official Plan was drafted more than 10 years ago. In accordance with the Planning Act and the City Council's directive granted in June 2002, review of the City's Official Plan was commenced. Extensive public consultation was undertaken under the "Our Brampton, Our Future" communications program over the past eighteen months that resulted in the release of a draft Official Plan by City Council on April 24, 2006.

The draft Official Plan proposes to strengthen the City's sustainable planning framework to ensure that Brampton continues to

grow in a sustainable manner as to create a compact, complete and transit-oriented city. To this end, updated population and employment forecasts were prepared and comprehensive changes are proposed in a number of policy areas including office, retail, transportation, environment, open space, cultural heritage and urban design. The policy structure is supported by a number of schedules and related maps which have been updated correspondingly with the use of Geographic Information System (GIS) technology. In addition, housekeeping amendments are made throughout the draft Official Plan to implement current best practices and the latest policies and legislation from the Province, Region of Peel and the City itself. The draft Official Plan has also adopted a new, more user-friendly format with photographs and images.

Wellington Street West, Brampton, and may be viewed between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. during the regular business week. The draft Official Plan is also available for review at all City of Brampton Public Library branches and on the City's website www.brampton.ca. Under the provisions of the Planning Act, you may appeal to the decision of City Council with respect to the adoption of a revised Official Plan.

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the City of Brampton in respect of the draft Official Plan does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or does not make written submissions to the City of Brampton before the draft Official Plan is adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.
