**TRANSPORTATION & TRANSIT MASTER PLAN (TTMP)
NOTICE OF (THIRD) PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE**

Brampton's innovative Transportation & Transit Master Plan will deliver a long term strategy to effectively and efficiently accommodate Brampton's transportation needs, with particular attention to increasing and improving the role of transit, as the City expands to over 650,000 people by 2030. New roads, interregional transit links and new transit technologies require a vision shared by all municipal stakeholders: residents, the business community, municipal and provincial government. The TTMP development process includes opportunities for all stakeholders to review and contribute to the emerging plan.

The TTMP Study is being conducted in accordance with the requirements of Phases 1 and 2 of the **Municipal Class Environmental Assessment** (Municipal Engineers Association, June 2000), an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act which will allow the City to proceed confidently with the recommendations of the master plan.

A *TTMP Road and Transit Summary* has been prepared based on transportation analysis and findings to-date, and public input that has been received through the course of the study. The Summary focuses on strategic transportation and transit needs and recommendations for network plans for the 2011, 2021, and 2031 horizon years. It documents the analysis completed, the preferred solutions, and estimated costs. Key recommendations include:

- **Continued expansion of the City's road infrastructure at a projected cost of \$810 million by 2031;**
- **Evolution of transit to a comprehensive grid-based system with higher service frequencies and enhanced connectivity within and beyond Brampton;**
- **Implementation of the AcceleRide bus rapid transit (BRT) initiative on Queen Street and Main Street in the short-term, and expansion to other major corridors.**

The *TTMP Road & Transit Summary* was received by Brampton's Planning, Design & Development Committee and subsequently endorsed by Council on March 29, 2004. The road and transit strategy presented in the Summary Report has now been brought forward for public consultation. Your input is vital to successfully completing the Transportation & Transit Master Plan. We want to ensure that anyone with an interest in this study has the opportunity to provide comments before a final transportation strategy is recommended for approval by Council in late Spring 2004.
