Dear Stakeholders,

A copy of the Brampton Brick presentation panels from the November 30, 2010 public information house are now available on the City's project website (http://www.brampton.ca/en/Business/planning-development/projects-studies/Pages/Norval-Quarry-Re-Zoning.aspx) above the "Announcements" section. Objections regarding Brampton Brick's Aggregate Resources Act (ARA) licence application may be filed during the 45-day notification period, which closes on **Monday, December 20, 2010**. Objections should be directed to the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) may be made in writing or via email to AggRes@Ontario.ca. Email objections must contain a postal address or they will not be considered acceptable. A copy of the objection must also be sent to Brampton Brick, in writing, by pre-paid regular mail by December 20, 2010. The addresses for the MNR and Brampton Brick are provided below:

Brampton Brick is required to attempt to resolve the objections received during the public notification period which concludes on December 20, 2010. The steps involved are as follows:

- Brampton Brick will circulate a proposal with recommendations to attempt resolving the objections received.
- If those submitting objections by December 20, 2010 are not prepared to withdraw, then Brampton Brick will circulate a final proposal in a formal "Notice of 20 Day Response Period."
- Within the 20-day response period set by Brampton Brick, the objector shall submit, in writing, to the Ministry of Natural Resources and to Brampton Brick, recommendations that may resolve the objection. If the recommendations are not delivered within 20 days, then it will be deemed that there is no longer an objection.

A copy of the latest staff report to be considered for the December 13 Planning, Design and Development Committee Meeting is available on the project website, in the "Staff Reports" section (top right-hand corner, under "Contact Us"). Staff is recommending that the City of Brampton file an objection to Brampton Brick's ARA licence application.
