

Stakeholder Update #5

Further to Stakeholder Update #4 dated September 8, 2010 (see below), the City of Brampton has been advised informally that the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) has declared the Aggregate Resources Act (ARA) license application from Brampton Brick complete.

City staff are following up with MNR and will provide a further stakeholder update once more information becomes available. When the City receives copies of the materials submitted to MNR in support of the ARA license application (anticipated at the end of the month), we will make this information available to the public at the Planning Counter on the 3rd floor of City Hall – again we will provide an update to the stakeholders once this or any other information becomes available.

Stakeholder Update #4

The applicant, Brampton Brick, advised the City that it submitted its Aggregate License application to the Ministry of Natural Resources. The MNR will review all documentation and technical reports submitted with the application to determine if it is complete. A complete submission does not constitute support of the application or indicate that the material contained in the supporting documentation will be acceptable.

Once the application is deemed complete, the applicant may proceed with the 45-day notification and consultation period, which includes a mandatory public information session. There is no time limit for the applicant to initiate this process. The notification period will begin when all details of the information session are published in the local newspaper. City staff anticipate the applicant is likely to proceed with such notice towards the end of this year.

Members of the public will be invited to attend the open house, where the applicant will be required to present and explain all the details of the proposal. Any member of the public or agency may submit written comments to the MNR within the 45-day notification period.

City staff continue to evaluate the proposal submissions from potential peer review consultants to review the technical reports that Brampton Brick has submitted related to its proposed applications. City staff expect to submit a report to Planning, Design and Development Committee later this year to provide details on the status of the rezoning application and the application for license submitted to the MNR.
