



PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSION

The City of Brampton's Planning, Design & Development Department will hold an informal Public Information Session on **Tuesday June 14, 2011**. The Session will be held in the City Hall Atrium, 2 Wellington Street West, Brampton, Ontario from 4:30 to 7:30 pm.

The purpose of this informal Public Information Session is to:

- **share information on the proposed Main Street South Heritage Conservation District (HCD)**
- **give an overview of the proposed district area and its characteristics**
- **outline a draft statement of cultural heritage value**
- **provide an opportunity for all stakeholders, including local residents, to offer input**

Your feedback will be reviewed and incorporated into the study, to help shape the design guidelines and implementation plan. Once the HCD plan and guidelines are developed, a second Public Information Session will be held to share the findings. There will also be a presentation to the Brampton Heritage Board (BHB).

After all of this, a final report will be presented to the City's Planning, Design and Development Committee. It will then be forwarded to Brampton City Council for a decision.

LOCATION:

The proposed Main Street South Heritage Conservation District study area generally includes the lands on the west and east side of Main Street South from Wellington Street West to the Etobicoke Creek. It includes Gage Park and some lands on the east side of Elizabeth Street. **Please see attached Map 1** – Location of Proposed Main Street South Heritage Conservation District.

PROPOSAL:

The Main Street South Neighbourhood is one of several potential Heritage Conservation Districts within the downtown area. Main Street South is a residential, tree-lined street with well-kept, primarily late 19th and early 20th century homes on large lots. This area is a 'gateway' into downtown from points south and remains one of the most important cultural heritage landscapes in Brampton.

Establishing a Heritage Conservation District will create a plan and guidelines to direct the revitalization, conservation, protection and enhancement of the Main Street South area.

A Heritage Conservation District (HCD) is created by by-law under Part V of the *Ontario Heritage Act*.
