CITY OF BRAMPTON EASTER HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

BRAMPTON, ON: Brampton City Hall will be closed April 10 and 13 for Good Friday and Easter Monday respectively, affecting a number of services that will either be unavailable or will operate under reduced service levels.

Along with City Hall, the Small Business Enterprise Centre and the City's Parks and Recreation Office will be closed. Residents will not be able to apply in person for marriage licences, pay parking fines, apply for employment with the City of Brampton or apply for building permits during this time. Works and Transportation crews will operate only on an emergency basis. For concerns dealing with roads, storm sewers, municipal by-law enforcement, road obstructions and parking, residents can call the City of Brampton's call centre at 905-874-2000.
