WITH FREE TRANSIT ON REMEMBRANCE DAY**

BRAMPTON, ON: Brampton Mayor Susan Fennell today announced the continuation of the free transit program for veterans on Remembrance Day.

This Thursday, November 11, 2010, all veterans can travel for free on Brampton Transit routes, including the Züm line, by identifying themselves with any of the following items:

- Uniform
- Medals
- Beret
- Blazer
- Brampton Transit Veterans Pass

“As Mayor, I am extremely proud of the City’s ongoing commitment to serving our veterans,” said Mayor Fennell. “This year, we will once again offer free rides on Brampton Transit to all veterans, as a token of our profound appreciation for their courage and service to our country.”

Brampton Transit will also observe one minute of silence at 11:00 a.m. on Remembrance Day to pause and reflect on the sacrifices made by Canadian veterans in the name of freedom and peace. During this observance, all buses will stop at the nearest safe location and all non-essential communications, including phone calls and radio communications, will cease.
