GTA Weekly Pass

Effective January 3, 2010, a new GTA Weekly Pass is available every Thursday for \$52.

Buy a new GTA Weekly Pass from any of our four Brampton Transit terminals.



Family Day Monday, February 15

Brampton Transit will operate on a Sunday/Holiday schedule. Transit stores will be closed.



Züm – Brampton Transit's Bus Rapid Transit system (BRT) will increase connectivity for residents in Brampton and throughout the GTA, providing direct links to York Region, Mississauga and Toronto. Züm will also boost the frequency and quality of Brampton Transit's overall service. The first Züm line will run along Queen Street from downtown Brampton (Queen St. and Main St.) to York University in York region. Service begins in fall 2010!



- **Arrive early.** Bus service may be impacted by snow and road conditions. Prepare ahead and get to your stop early. If possible, consider taking an earlier bus.
- **Dress for the weather.** In the event that service is delayed, be prepared and dress warmly. Although the ride will be warm, your trip to and from the bus stop may not be.
- **Be careful.** In wet or icy conditions, use caution when walking on sidewalks or platforms and when boarding the bus. It also helps if you kick the snow from your shoes before stepping on the bus.
- **Stand back from the curb.** Icy roads are slippery. Move forward once the bus has come to a complete stop.
- **Wear bright clothes.** With shorter days and falling snow, make sure that you are visible to the bus operator.
- **Don't blame the bus operator.** If your bus is late, remember that your bus operator is doing his or her best to make sure you arrive at your destination safely despite bad weather conditions.

It pays to go green too! Weekly and monthly Brampton Transit passes and GTA Weekly passes are eligible for a 15% transit tax credit.
