

### Passenger Safety Guidelines

1. Passengers are required to pay the applicable fare or provide a valid transfer. Transfers must be requested upon initial boarding.
2. Passengers may not smoke, drink or consume food on the bus.
3. Please move to the back of the bus and EXIT through the back doors.
4. Aggressive behaviour, swearing, yelling or the use of profane or discriminatory language, is not permitted. Customers engaging in inappropriate behaviour may be asked to leave the bus.
5. Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times. The wearing of roller blades or skates is strictly prohibited.
6. Please do not engage in lengthy conversations with the Bus Operator.
7. Headphones must be worn while playing any electronic devices.
8. Strollers are permitted providing they do not obstruct the aisles.
9. Carriage of animals is restricted to "service" animals and dogs on leashes. Small non-exotic pets, when carried without danger or offense to other customers, are permitted. The owner of any such animal is solely responsible for the behaviour of that animal should it cause a disturbance, nuisance or threaten the safety of any other persons.
10. Firearms, prohibited weapons, chemicals, toxic substances and flammables are not permitted.
11. The transportation of large or bulk items will be permitted providing there is adequate room on the bus.

Failure to comply with these guidelines may result in suspension of right to board.

Brampton Transit will be operating on a Sunday/Holiday schedule for both of these holidays. Transit stores will be closed.

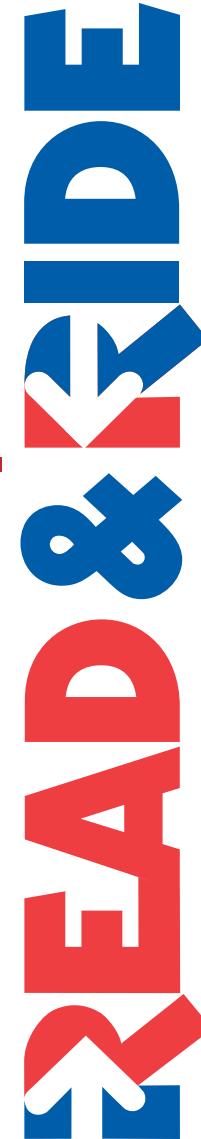

## Service Improvements effective Tuesday, September 8





Brampton Transit's 2009 Service Improvements will be implemented on Tuesday, September 8. Improvements will be made to 24 routes and four routes will be made accessible.

With public input, Brampton Transit has evaluated its system and worked to improve upon it to meet the demands of a growing city. The service improvements are designed to:

- Improve schedule reliability
- Enhance integration with other GTA transit systems and
- Prepare for Brampton's Bus Rapid Transit system, Züm

<b>1 QUEEN</b>	• Later service added to Sunday evening
<b>2 MAIN</b>	• Route realigned at the south end and extended to Derry Road/407 GO Park & Ride • Weekday Midday frequency increased to every 15 minutes • Later service added to Sunday evening • Improved connections with Mississauga Transit and GO Transit
<b>3 McLAUGHLIN</b>	• Weekday Peak frequency increased to every 15 minutes • Later service added to Sunday evening
<b>4 CHINGUACOUSY</b>	• Weekday Peak frequency increased to every 10 minutes
<b>4A CHINGUACOUSY</b>	• <b>NEW</b> branch of Route 4 to Mount Pleasant GO via Creditview Road operating during the Weekday Peak periods <b>only</b> • Covers area previously serviced by Route 26 • Operates north-south on Chinguacousy Road in the south, regular Route 4 still operates via Lockwood Road
<b>5 BOVAIRD</b>	• Weekday Peak frequency increased to every 12 minutes • Later service added to Sunday evening

<b>10 SOUTH INDUSTRIAL</b>	• Limited late night service added to Weekday evenings
<b>11 STEELES</b>	• Schedule adjustments to Weekday PM Peak schedule
<b>14 TORBRAM</b>	• Weekday Peak frequency increased to every 15 minutes
<b>15/ 15A BRAMALEA</b>	• Weekday Peak frequency increased to every 20 minutes on both routes 15 and 15A • Service frequency improved to every 10 minutes between Bovaird Drive & Bramalea GO Station
<b>20 EAST INDUSTRIAL</b>	• Limited late service added to Weekday evenings
<b>21 HEART LAKE</b>	 <b>NEW</b> Accessible Route
<b>23 SANDALWOOD</b>	• Weekday AM and PM Peak frequency increased to every 20 minutes
<b>24 VAN KIRK</b>	• Route realigned in north end, extended north on Van Kirk Drive to Wanless Road  <b>NEW</b> Accessible Route
<b>25 EDENBROOK</b>	• Additional Weekday Early Evening trip  <b>NEW</b> Accessible Route
<b>26 FLETCHERS MEADOW</b>	• <b>ROUTE ELIMINATED</b> • Service coverage provided by changes to Route 4 & 4A Chinguacousy
<b>29 WILLIAMS</b>	• Route realigned in the east end to provide a direct connection to Queen Street
<b>30 AIRPORT RD</b>	• Weekday Peak frequency increased to every 15 minutes
<b>40 CENTRAL INDUSTRIAL</b>	• Limited late night service added to Weekday evenings
<b>50 GORE ROAD</b>	• Route extended north to Castle Oaks Cross and Cardinal Ambrozic Secondary School • Weekday AM and PM Peak frequency increased to every 20 minutes
<b>52 McMURCHY</b>	• Schedule adjustment to Saturday Late Evening
<b>53 JAMES POTTER</b>	• Schedule adjustment to Weekday PM peak
<b>77 HIGHWAY 7</b>	• Weekday Midday, Weekday Early Evening and Saturday Midday frequency increased to every 20 minutes
<b>77A YORK UNIVERSITY</b>	• Additional Midday and Early Evening Trips to and from York University  <b>NEW</b> Accessible Route
<b>92 GO SHUTTLE B</b>	• Route <b>RENAMED</b> to 92 Bramalea GO Shuttle • Schedule adjustment to Weekday PM peak
<b>101 AIRPORT EXPRESS</b>	• Additional stops provided along route
<b>200 TURNER FENTON</b>	• Schedule adjusted
