Potential Disruptions

What are some common potential disruptions facing your workplace environment?

- Extreme weather (ice storms, tornados)
- Fire
- Flooding
- Gas leaks
- Hazardous spills, chemical spills
- Interruption of essential services (water, public transit)
- Loss of communications (telephones, Internet)
- Loss of employees (illness, epidemic)
- Loss of access to premise (damage/loss of facility)
- Power outage
- Security alert (malicious acts threatening physical security, bomb threats, suspicious packages)
- Supply chain interruption
- Computer failure (loss of data, virus, cyber-attack)
- Theft

Potential Impacts

The following list describes the impact the Corporation may face with the occurrence of any of the disruptions listed above.

- Damage to infrastructure and facilities
- Damage to reputation/credibility
- Harm to environment
- Poor customer service/delay of service/unable to provide service to customers
- Loss of revenue (economic/financial loss)
- Regulatory penalties/legal action
