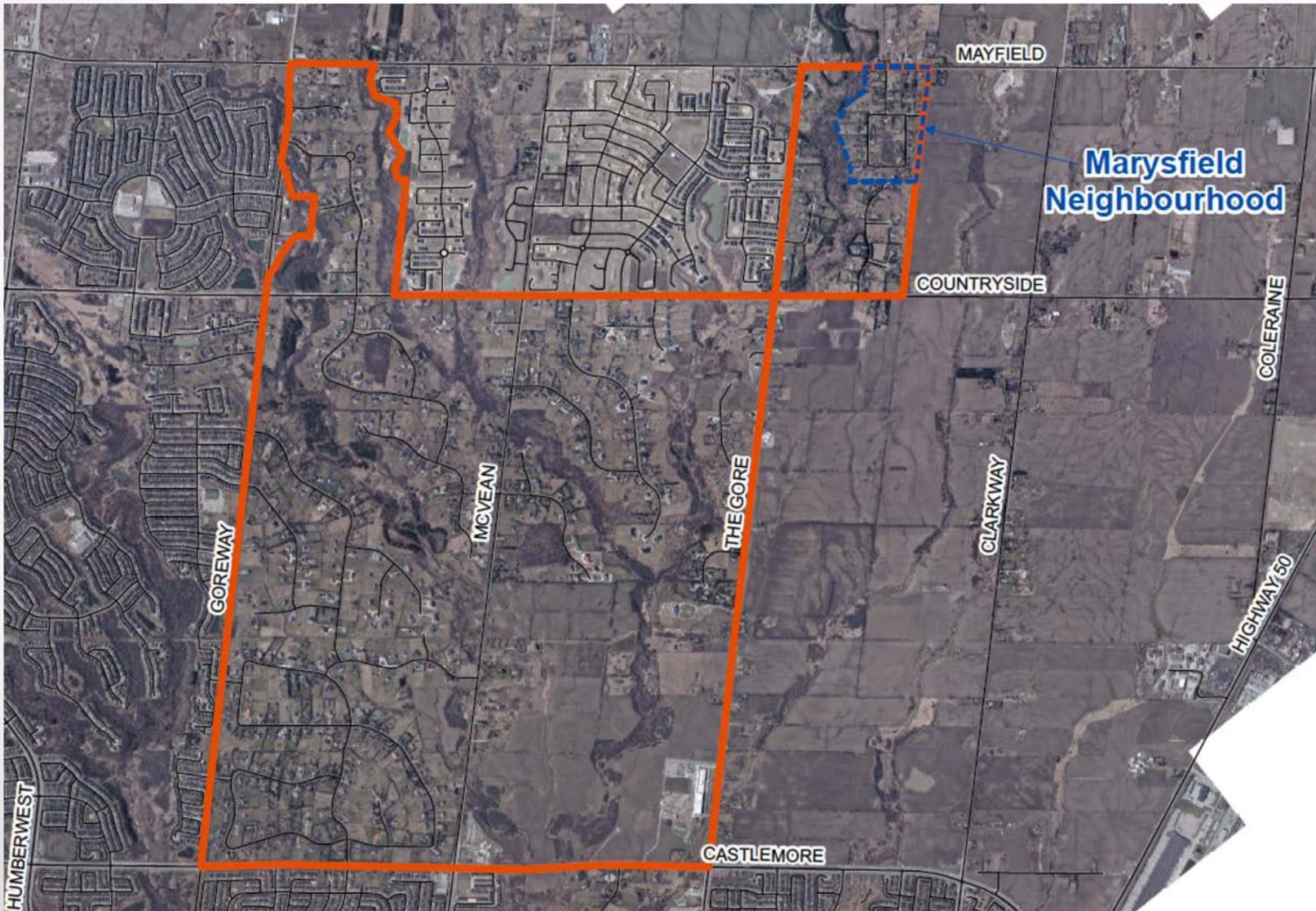

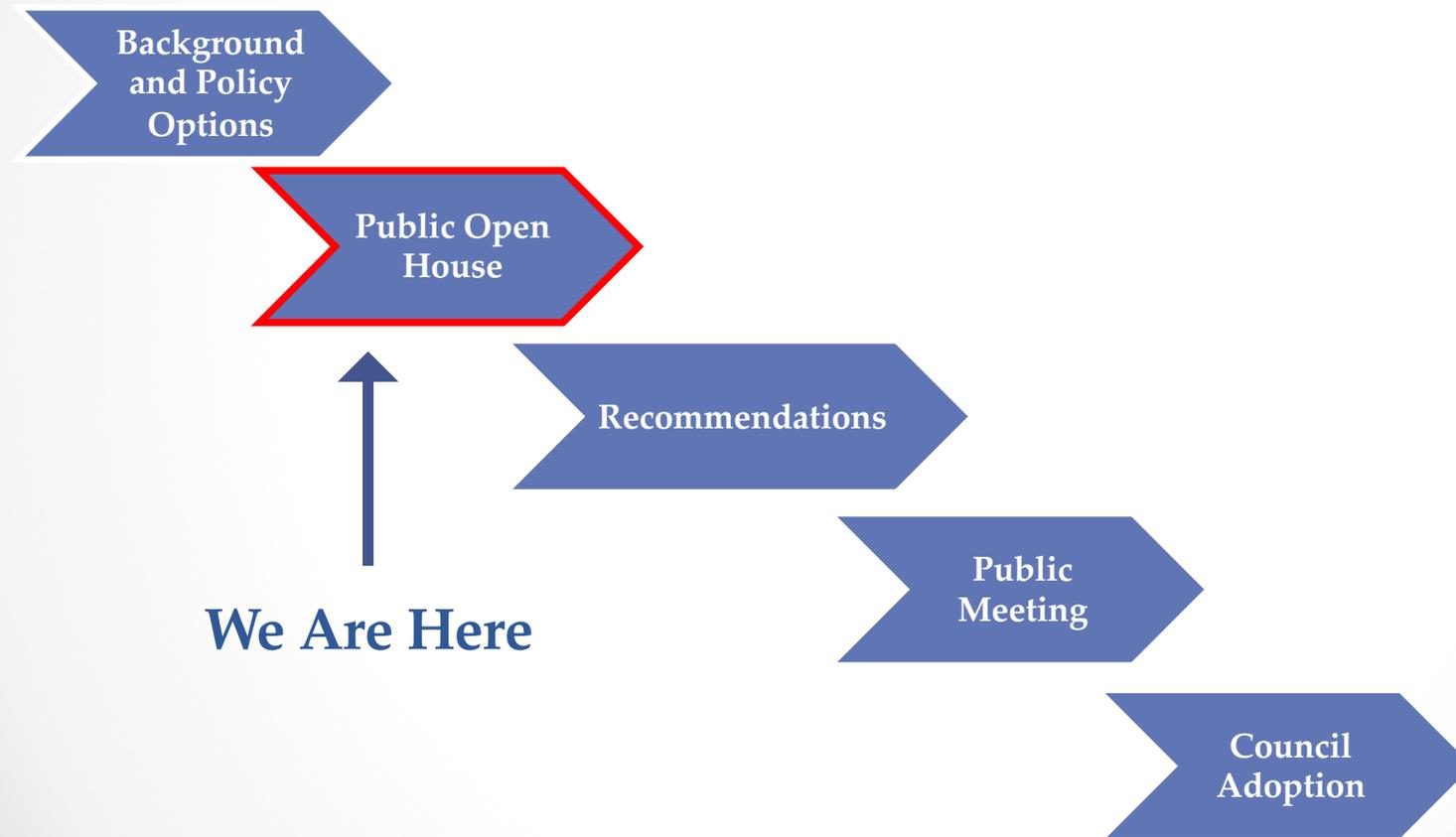

## Study Purpose

- Overall Toronto Gore Estate Residential Community Policy Review
  - To identify character defining elements of Toronto Gore
  - Options and Recommendations to protect this character
  - To examine the potential for introducing urban residential densities on undeveloped lands (supply and demand analysis)
- Focus on Marysfield Neighbourhood
  - To conduct a detailed character review of Marysfield
  - Policy and Zoning options to protect this character

# Study Process



## What is Character?

- Character is a collection of all the elements (public and private realm) that make you “feel” like you’re in a unique place
- It’s important to recognize the individual elements (road pattern, landscaping, building height, etc...) that contribute to the character of a place
- It’s even MORE important to understand the synergy between the elements of character, and how they work together to define a sense of place

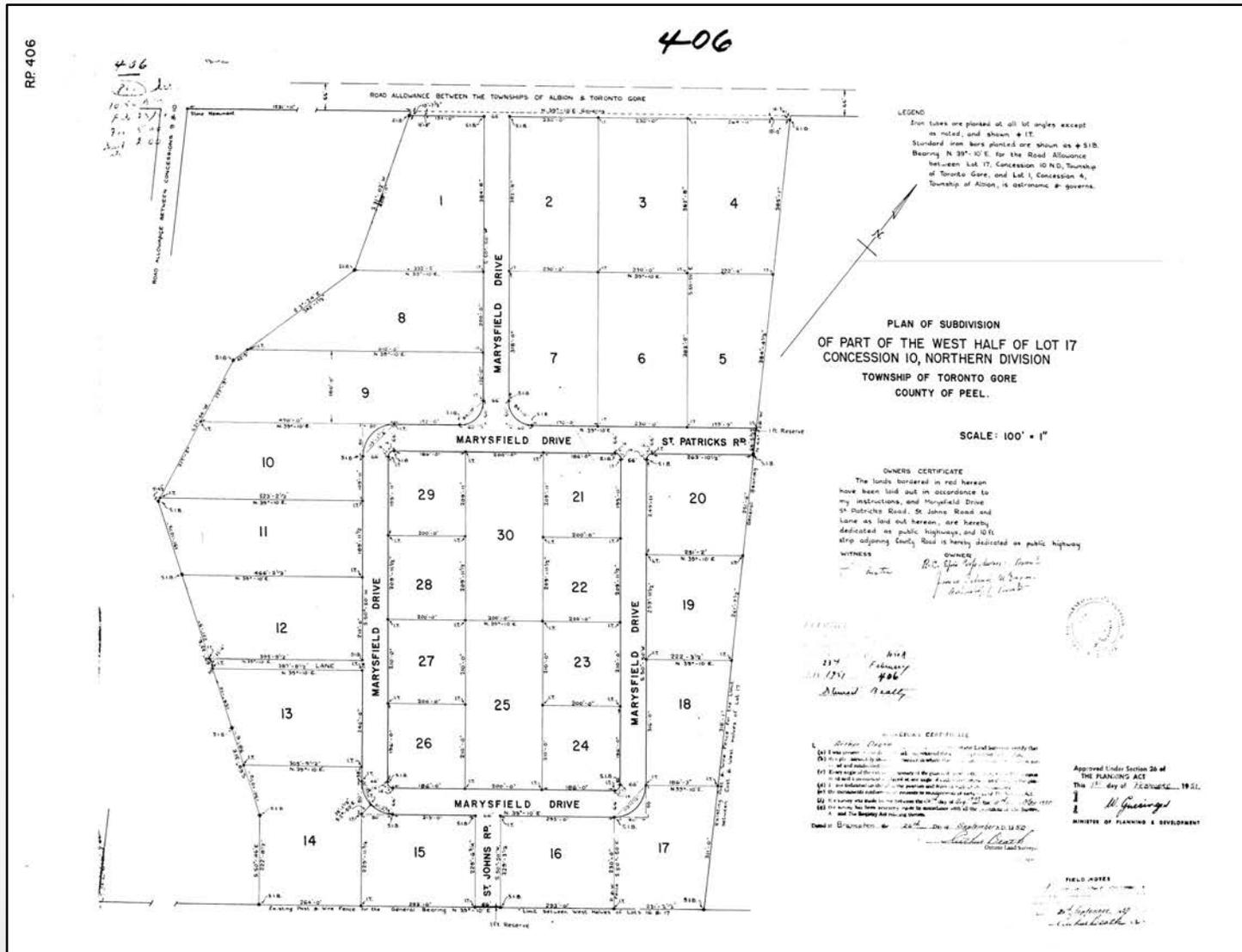


## What is Character?

- Think about your neighbourhood as a room
- The street and yards are the floor, the buildings are the walls, and all the things in between are the furniture
- The look and spacing of all these elements together define the character of the “room”

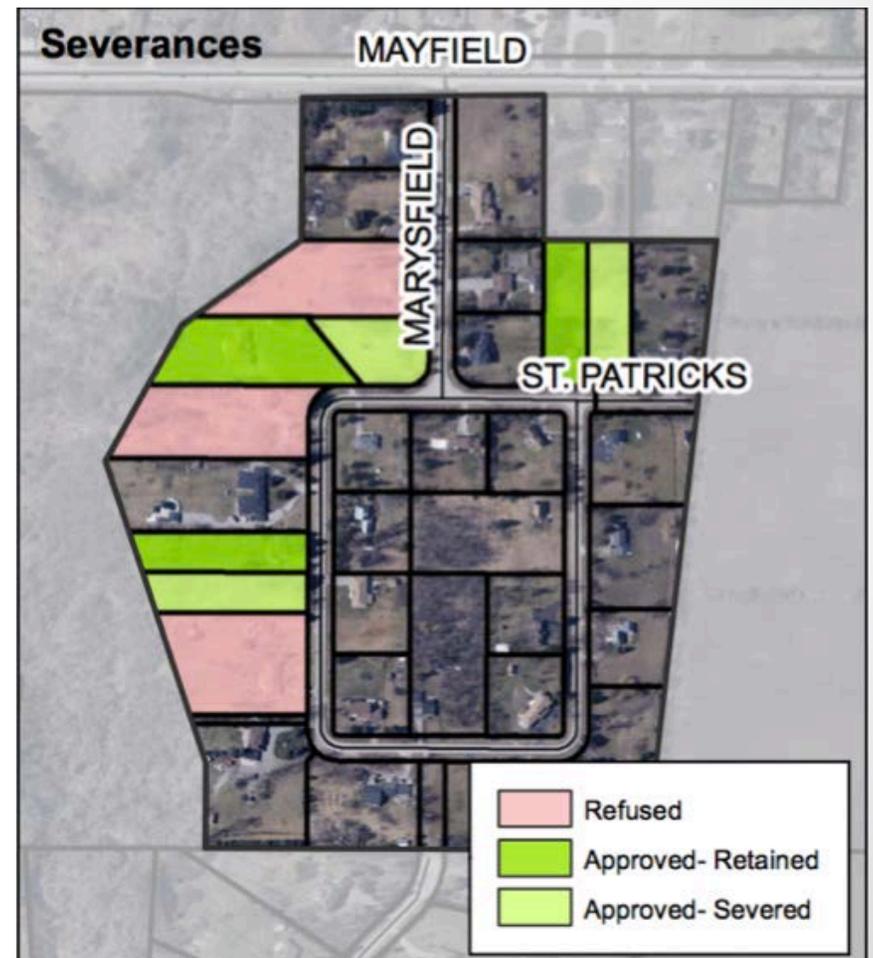
## Marysfield Neighbourhood: Character Analysis

- Unique characteristics (compared to broader Toronto Gore area)
- Historical significance (first co-operative housing in Ontario & rosary street pattern)
- Mature tree canopy



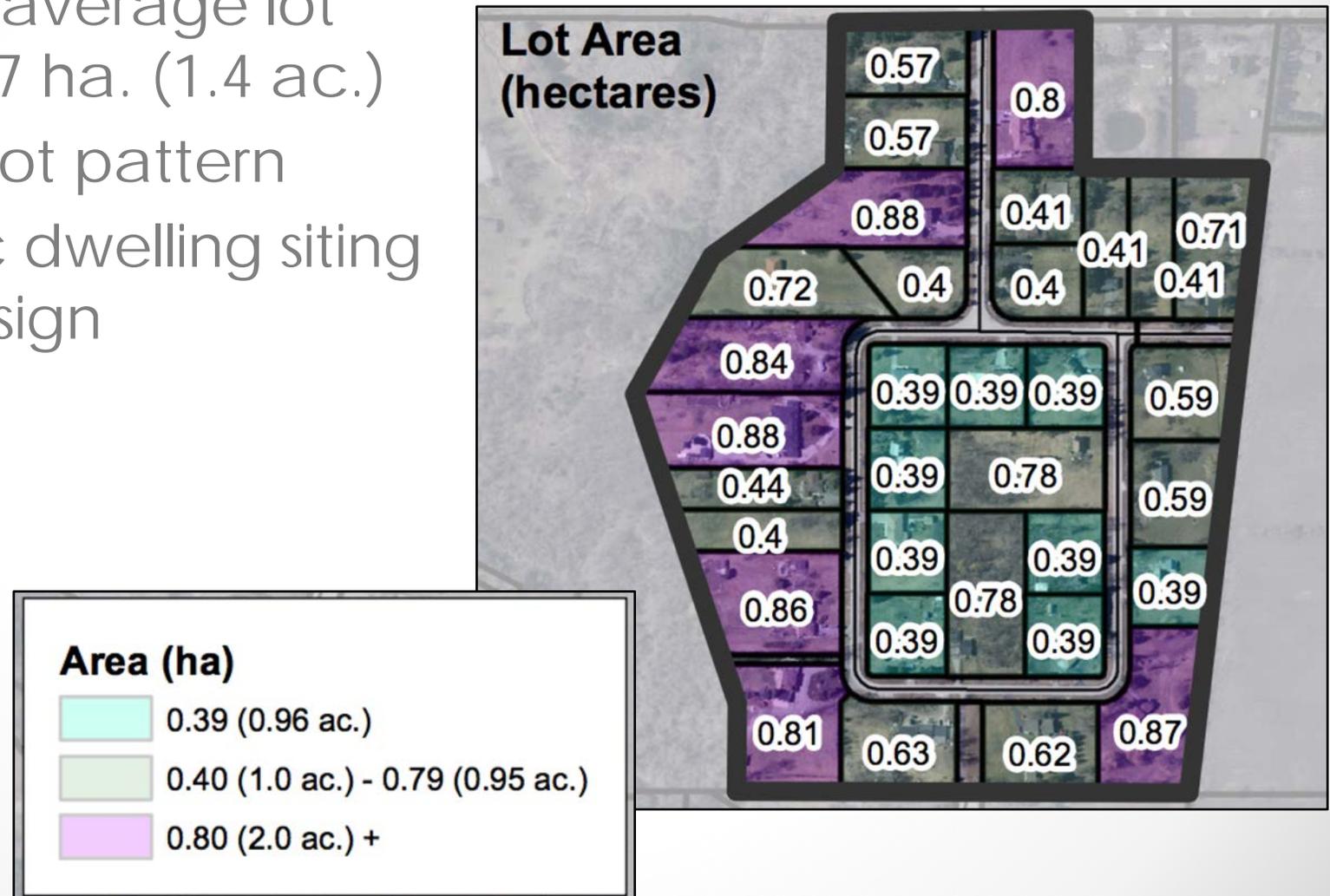
## Marysfield Neighbourhood: Character Analysis

- Recent severance applications
  - 3 approved
  - 3 refused



## Marysfield Neighbourhood: Character Analysis

- Smaller average lot size: 0.57 ha. (1.4 ac.)
- Varied lot pattern
- Eclectic dwelling siting and design



## Marysfield Neighbourhood: Character Analysis

- Existing Lot Frontages
  - Ranging from 28 metres to 120 metres

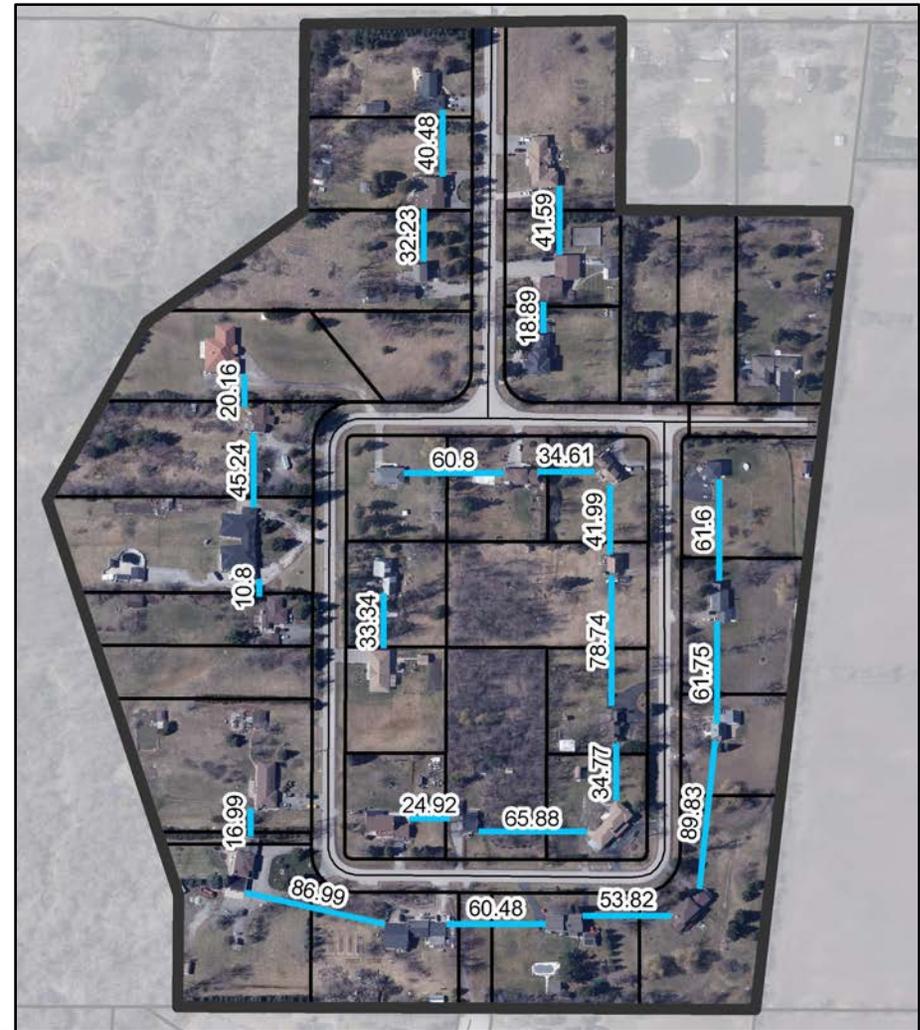

# Marysfield Neighbourhood: Character Analysis

- Existing Separation Distances

- o Ranging from 11 metres to 90 metres

# Policy Options

Options	Description
Do Nothing	Leave Marysfield alone
Development Criteria – Built Form	Criteria for compatible built scale, height, massing, setbacks and dwelling placement
Development Criteria - Severances	Severances only permitted where proposed lot frontages reflect predominant character
Heritage	Identify character elements of Marysfield that contribute to its historic identity

# Zoning Options

Options	Description
Minimum Lot Frontage	Identify a minimum lot frontage requirement for new lots
Maximum Lot Coverage	Identify a maximum percentage of a lot that may be occupied by a dwelling
Minimum Dwelling Separation	Identify a minimum separation distance between dwellings
Siting of Dwelling on a Lot	Identify requirements for the location and orientation of dwellings on a lot
Minimum Front Yard Depth	Identify a minimum required front yard depth to ensure consistent setbacks from the street
Minimum Front Yard Landscaping	Identify a minimum amount of landscaped open space in the front yards
