The City of Brampton is exercising prudent decision-making to provide the services and infrastructure our growing city needs. **A zero per cent** increase on the City’s portion of the property tax bill keeps Brampton’s municipal tax rate among the lowest in the GTA. For the average household in Brampton, this is equivalent to **\$73**, which includes the hospital levy.

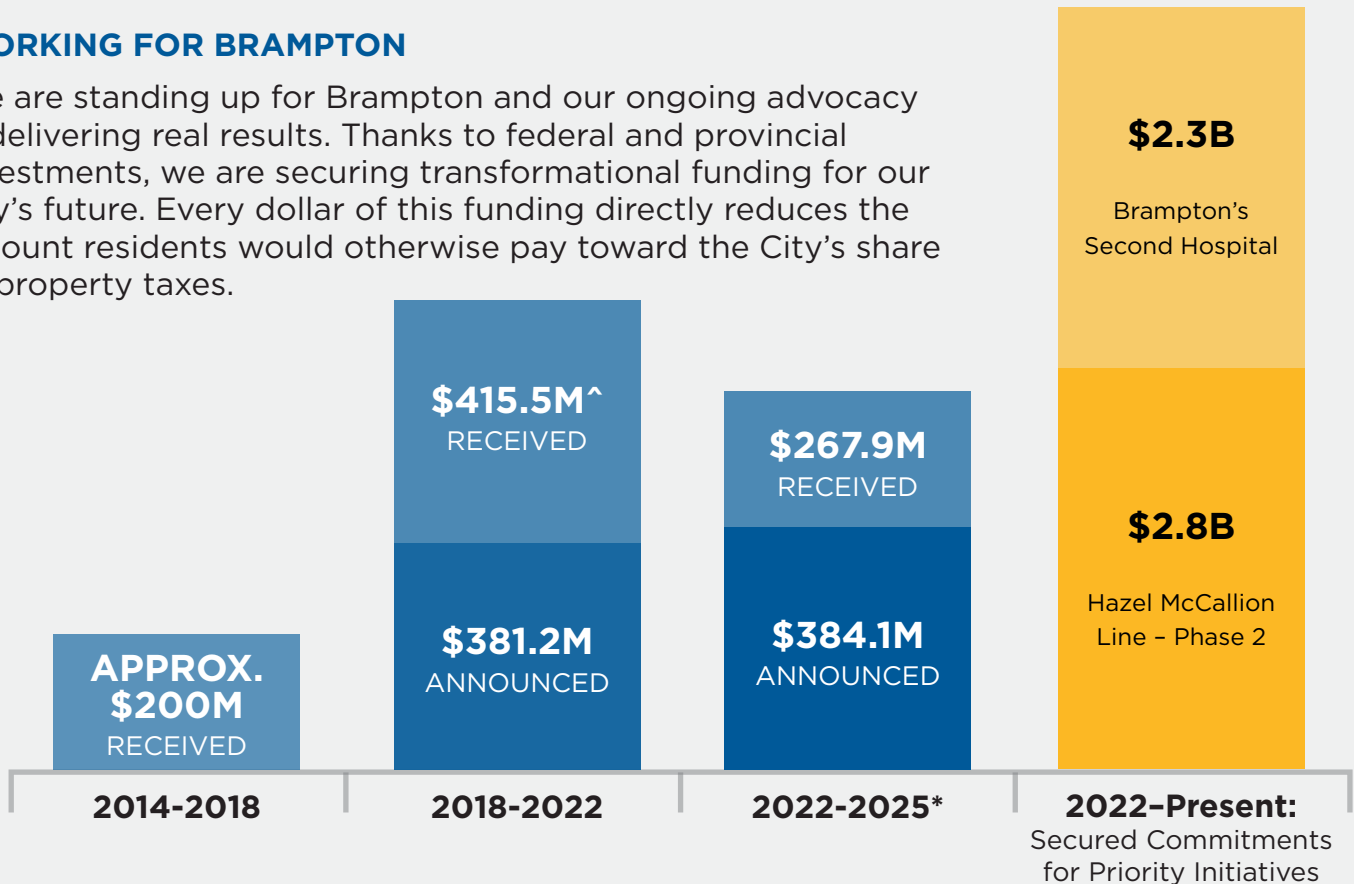

WORKING FOR BRAMPTON

We are standing up for Brampton and our ongoing advocacy is delivering real results. Thanks to federal and provincial investments, we are securing transformational funding for our city’s future. Every dollar of this funding directly reduces the amount residents would otherwise pay toward the City’s share of property taxes.

PRIORITIZING SAFETY

We continue to address illegal housing, non-compliance and absentee landlords. Our enforcement presence is increasing by 8 part-time and 4 full-time staff to improve parking management and road safety, and 10 part-time staff for seasonal enforcement. In addition, 48 full-time and 10 part-time staff will be dedicated to rental housing compliance. We are also adding 24 new firefighters to our team to help ensure timely emergency response across the community.



ELECTRIFYING THE FUTURE OF TRANSIT

We are investing in the electrification of our transit fleet. We will add 44 new electric buses to our existing fleet, helping modernize transit service while reducing emissions. This reflects our commitment to sustainability and to achieving the City's GHG reduction targets.





ENVIRONMENTAL RESILIENCE & SUSTAINABILITY

We're investing in energy efficiency and healthier green spaces to protect our environment and reduce GHG emissions. In 2026, funding supports the Grow Green Festival, restoration of wetlands and natural areas, 50,000 trees plantings and planning to address climate change and invasive species.



ARTS & CULTURE

We continue to deliver arts and culture as a core municipal service, providing residents with accessible cultural programming across Brampton. In 2026, this includes expanded programming in key venues and public spaces, such as new investments at Historic Bovaird House and preparations for The Rose Theatre's 20th anniversary. The City also supports the local arts ecosystem through paid professional opportunities for artists delivered through City-led programming and public art, organizational grant opportunities and an approximate \$1M annual investment in sector development through the Brampton Arts Organization.



INNOVATION & ECONOMIC GROWTH

We're focused on innovation, talent and job creation to build a strong and resilient local economy. This includes growing the Brampton Innovation District as a hub for innovation, entrepreneurship and cybersecurity by investing \$800K in BHive, which is launching a new AI-focused program to adopt and integrate artificial intelligence solutions for small and medium-sized businesses; \$1M for the Brampton Venture Zone; and \$1M for the Cybersecure Catalyst. These investments attract new businesses, create quality jobs and strengthen Brampton's position as a competitive, future-ready city.
