

OFFICE CONSOLIDATION

BY-LAW 179-84

To prohibit the slaughtering of animals for food, other than in a slaughterhouse

WHEREAS paragraph 94 of section 210 of the <u>Municipal Act</u> (R.S.O. 1980, c. 302, as amended) authorizes the councils of local municipalities to pass by-laws for prohibiting or regulating and inspecting the erection or continuance of slaughterhouses, and for prohibiting the slaughter of animals intended for food, except in slaughterhouses designated in the by-law;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of 8rampton ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. In this by-law:
 - (a) "animal" includes cattle, sheep, swine, goats, game, rabbits, fowl and poultry;
 - (b) "<u>food</u>" means food for human consumption.
- 2. No person shall slaughter an animal intended for food except in a slaughterhouse designated in Schedule A to this by-law.
- 3. Notwithstanding section 2 of this by-law, the slaughter of animals on land assessed as farm property, for the use of the occupants of the property, is permitted.
- 4. Any person who contravenes the provisions of section 2 of this by-law is guilty of an offence, and, upon conviction, is liable to a fine not to exceed Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), exclusive of costs, in respect of each offence.
