# BY-LAW

Number 2-2009

To enact a By-law to deem Lots 10, 11, 12, 17, 18, 19 and 20 ON Plan TOR-6 not to be Part of a Registered Plan of Subdivision for the purposes of subsection 50(3) of the Planning Act

**WHEREAS** City Council has passed By-law No. 288-2008 authorizing that Albert Street be stopped up, closed and declared surplus.

**AND WHEREAS** it is deemed expedient that Albert Street merge with the adjacent landowner's lands upon closing of the sale transaction.

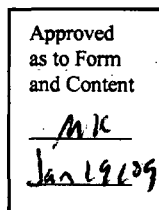
**AND WHEREAS** section 50(4) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13, permits Council by By-law to designate any plan of subdivision or part thereof, that has been registered for eight years or more, to be deemed not to be a registered plan of subdivision for the purpose of section 50(3) of the Planning Act.

**AND WHEREAS** Registered Plan TOR-6 was registered on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June, 1855.


**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. That Lots 10, 11, 12, 17, 18, 19 and 20 on Plan TOR-6 are hereby deemed not to be part of a registered plan of subdivision for the purposes of subsection 50(3) of the Planning Act.
2. That the City Clerk be directed to send the notice of passage of the by-law as required by the Planning Act.
