BY-LAW

Number 43-2010

To Appoint Municipal By-law Enforcement
Officers and to Repeal By-law 13-2010

WHEREAS subsection 8(1) of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, provides that the powers of a municipality under the *Municipal Act, 2001* or any other Act shall be interpreted broadly so as to confer broad authority on the municipality to enable the municipality to govern its affairs as it considers appropriate and to enhance the municipality's ability to respond to municipal issues;

AND WHEREAS section 9 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, confers upon a municipality the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purpose of exercising its authority under the *Municipal Act, 2001* or any other Act;

AND WHEREAS section 227 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, establishes the role of officers and employees of the municipality to, among other things, carry out duties required under the *Municipal Act, 2001* or any other Act and other duties assigned by the municipality;

AND WHEREAS section 15 of the *Police Services Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.15, as amended, authorizes a municipal council to appoint Municipal Law Enforcement Officers, who shall be peace officers for the purpose of enforcing municipal by-laws,

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

1. The persons named in Schedule I attached hereto are hereby appointed as Municipal Law Enforcement Officers for The Corporation of the City of Brampton
2. By-law 13-2010 is hereby repealed.
3. A municipal law enforcement officer appointed by this By-law may enter on land at any reasonable time for the purpose of carrying out an inspection to determine whether or not the following are being complied with:
 - (a) a by-law of The Corporation of the City of Brampton passed under the *Municipal Act, 2001*, as amended;
 - (b) a direction or order of The Corporation of the City of Brampton made under the *Municipal Act, 2001*, as amended, or made under a by-law;

- (c) a condition of a license issued under a by-law; or
 - (d) an order made under section 431 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, as amended.
4. A municipal law enforcement officer exercising a power of entry may:
- (a) require production for inspection of documents or things relevant to the inspection;
 - (b) inspect and remove documents or things relevant to the inspection for the purpose of making copies or extracts;
 - (c) require information from any person concerning a matter related to the inspection; and
 - (d) alone or in conjunction with a person possessing special or expert knowledge, make examinations or take tests, samples or photographs necessary for the purposes of the inspection.
5. Subject to section 6, this By-law prevails to the extent of any conflict between this By-law and any other by-law of The Corporation of the City of Brampton.
6. This by-law does not restrict any rights conferred by the *Municipal Act, 2001*, as amended, or any other Act or regulation, respecting entry to land.
