THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON

BY-LAW

Number 61-78

Being a By-law to appoint a Lottery Licensing Officer and provide for licence fees and to repeal By-law 7-74.

WHEREAS the Municipal Act provides that the Councils of all municipalities may pass by-laws for appointing such officers and servants as may be necessary for the purposes of the Corporation.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to appoint a Lottery Licensing Officer.

AND WHEREAS by regulations made by the Ministry of Financial and Commercial Affairs a Municipal Council may set fees and charges for the issuing of such licences not exceeding such limits as may be prescribed by the Minister.


AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to set the fees payable for Lotteries.


NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

1. That Edward L. Hore is appointed Lottery Licensing Officer and Lynn Evans Deputy Licensing Officer for the Corporation of the City of Brampton.
2. That the said Edward L. Hore and the said Lynn Evans shall hold office during the pleasure of the Council and shall exercise all the authority, powers and rights and shall perform all the duties and obligations which by Statute or by-laws are or may be conferred or imposed upon the Lottery Licensing Officer and any other duties that may be imposed by Council.
3. That the said lottery licensing officers be authorized to grant permission to local charitable organizations to sell lottery tickets for agencies from outside the City who have received a Provincial licence or Municipal licence, provided that:

- (a) the executive of the local group approaches the City.
 - (b) the request includes a photocopy of the Provincial licence.
 - (c) a letter is filed indicating a statement of the charitable purposes to which all proceeds received by the local organization will be donated.
 - (d) that no public display of tickets or efforts to sell tickets to the general public, on the street or in commercial outlets, will commence until the approval of the lottery licence, by the lottery officer, has been granted. For the purposes of this policy a charitable organization will mean an organization which performs services of public good or welfare, without profit, within the community.
4. That requests for permission to sell lottery tickets within the City of Brampton from outside agencies, other than charitable organizations, be placed before Council for approval.
5. Each application for a lottery licence shall be in the prescribed form and shall be accompanied by the appropriate fee in accordance with the schedule of fees attached hereto and forming part of this By-law.
6. That By-law 7-74 be and the same is hereby repealed.

READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD TIME and PASSED in Open Council this 6th day of March, 1978.

SCHEDULE OF FEES

BINGO LOTTERIES

(A) For single Bingo Lottery Licence:

Where the sum entered at Section (3) of the application does not exceed \$500.00, a fee of \$2.00 (payable to Treasurer, Corporation of the City of Brampton).

Where the sum entered at Section (3) of the application exceeds \$500.00 and not more than \$5,000.00, a fee of 2% of the total value of prizes to be awarded (payable to Treasurer, Corporation of the City of Brampton).

Where the sum entered at Section (3) of the application exceeds \$5,000.00, a fee equal to 2% of the total value of prizes to be awarded. (Payable to the Treasurer of Ontario).

(B) For a series of Bingo Lotteries covered by one licence:

Where the sum entered at Section (3) of the application does not exceed \$500.00, a fee of \$2.00 multiplied by the number of lotteries to be operated in the period shown. (Payable to Treasurer, Corporation of the City of Brampton).

Where the sum entered at Section (3) of the application exceeds \$500.00 and not more than \$5,000.00, a fee of 2% of the total value of prizes to be awarded multiplied by the number of lotteries to be operated in the period shown. (Payable to Treasurer, Corporation of the City of Brampton).

Where the sum entered at Section (3) of the application exceeds \$5,000.00, a fee equal to 2% of the total value of prizes to be awarded multiplied by the number of lotteries to be operated in the period shown. (Payable to the Treasurer of Ontario).

RAFFLE LOTTERIES

Where the sum entered at Section (2) of the application does not exceed \$5,000.00, a fee of 2% of the total value of prizes to be awarded. (Payable to Treasurer, Corporation of the City of Brampton).

SCHEDULE OF FEES

BAZAAR LOTTERY SCHEME

For each lottery type scheme to be conducted at a bazaar, a fee of \$10.00. (Payable to Treasurer, Corporation of the City of Brampton).
