
To authorize the purchase of
certain lands for the purpose of
road widening


Section 6 of the *Municipal Act 2001* authorizes the Council of every corporation to pass a by-law for acquiring or expropriating any land required for the purposes of the corporation. The Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton has determined that it is necessary and in the interest of The Corporation of the City of Brampton to acquire the lands herein described for road widening purposes.

NOW THEREFORE The Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. The purchase of the lands described as part of Lot 14, Concession 4 West of Hurontario Street, City of Brampton, Regional Municipality of Peel, designated as Parts 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, 43R-25984, together with a permanent easement over part of Lot 14, Concession 4 West of Hurontario Street, City of Brampton, Regional Municipality of Peel, designated as Parcels D and F on the sketch attached hereto as Schedule A and a temporary easement over part of Lot 14, Concession 4 West of Hurontario Street, City of Brampton, Regional Municipality of Peel, designated as Parcels B and G on the sketch attached hereto as Schedule A, for the purposes of road widening, is hereby authorized.
2. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of The Corporation of the City of Brampton an agreement of purchase and sale, in a form approved by the City Solicitor, between E. Morris and M. Kocicka and The Corporation of the City of Brampton, together with all other documents that in the opinion of the City Solicitor are necessary to effect the purchase of the said land.
3. The funds for the acquisition shall be taken from capital project account #024020 – Land Acquisitions.

READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD TIME and PASSED in Open Council this 29th day of March, 2004.
