



THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON

BY-LAW

Number 128-2002

To stop up and close and authorize
the sale of part of Bramtree Court

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient in the interest of The Corporation of the City of Brampton that the part of Bramtree Court described in Schedule A to this by-law be stopped up and closed, and that part of the lands stopped up and closed be sold to the owners of the abutting lands;

AND WHEREAS notice of the intention to pass this by-law has been published once a week for four consecutive weeks in the Brampton Guardian, a newspaper published in the City of Brampton;


AND WHEREAS the said Corporation has given notice to The Regional Municipality of Peel, pursuant to Section 44 of the Regional Municipalities Act (R.S.O. 1990, c.R. 8, as amended) via registered mail on April 12, 2002 advising the Region of the City's intention to pass this by-law and the Corporation has not received any objection from The Regional Municipality of Peel to the passage of this by-law;


AND WHEREAS the Council for the said Corporation has heard in person or by counsel, solicitor or agent, all persons claiming that their land will be prejudicially affected by this by-law and who applied to be heard;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. The part of Bramtree Court described in Schedule A to this by-law is hereby stopped up and closed and the said lands are hereby declared to be surplus.
2. The transfer for \$0.00 of the parts of Bramtree Court described in Schedule A to the owners of the abutting lands is hereby authorized.
3. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute all documents and instruments approved by the City Solicitor as may be necessary to effect the conveyance of the said lands.
5. The affidavit of Leonard J. Mikulich attached as Schedule B to this by-law forms part of this by-law.


I, **LEONARD J. MIKULICH**, of the City of Brampton, in the Regional Municipality of Peel, **MAKE OATH AND SAY:**
