Number 129-2002

To Establish Tax ratios For The Year 2002

WHEREAS the Council of The Regional Municipality of Peel, by By-Law No. 9-2002, passed the 14th day of February, 2002, delegated the authority to pass a by-law establishing the tax ratios for both lower-tier and upper-tier purposes for the year 2002 to the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton:

AND WHEREAS is it necessary for the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton, pursuant to the Municipal Act, as amended, to establish the tax ratios for 2002 for the purposes of The Regional Municipality of Peel and The Corporation of the City of Brampton;

AND WHEREAS the tax ratios determine the relative amounts of taxation to be borne by each property class;

AND WHEREAS the property classes have been defined and prescribed by the Assessment Act and the Regulations thereto;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

1. For the taxation year 2002, the tax ratio for the property in:
 - 1.1 the residential/farm property class is 1.0;
 - 1.2 the multi-residential property class is 1.7336;
 - 1.3 the commercial property class is 1.2971;
 - 1.4 the industrial property class is 1.5986;
 - 1.5 the pipelines property class is 0.9239;
 - 1.6 the farmlands property classes is 0.25;
 - 1.7 the managed forest property class is 0.25.
2. For the purpose of this by-law:
 - 2.1 the commercial property class includes all commercial office property, shopping centre property and parking lot property;
 - 2.2 the industrial property class includes all large industrial property.
3. This by-law shall come into force and take effect immediately upon enactment.

READ a FIRST, SECOND, AND THIRD TIME and passed in Open Council this 13th day of May, 2002.
