BY-LAW

Number 134-97

A By-law for the Numbering of Buildings and Lots Within the City of Brampton and to Repeal By-law 67-88

WHEREAS the *Municipal Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c.M.45 enables Councils of local municipalities to pass by-laws for the numbering of buildings and lots within the municipality, and

WHEREAS it is desirable to do so, The Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton hereby enacts as follows:

1. Every owner of a building or lot along any highway, street, or road, or any other property which Council deems necessary to number, shall affix the assigned number to their building or property.
2. Every owner shall affix to their property the assigned number in such a manner that is readable from the street line, and the size of number must not be less than four (4") inches in height.
3. Numbers may be assigned or re-assigned if deemed necessary by Council because of a change or addition to a building or street configuration.
4. Records of assigned numbers on streets shall be maintained by the Planning and Building Departments.
5. The Commissioner of Planning and Building is responsible for the administration of the By-law.
6. Where an owner fails to affix the required numbers to a building or property, the City of Brampton may upon seven (7) days' notice enter on and number the lot or property at the expense of the owner. Such expense may be collected in a manner like taxes.

7. Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine as provided for in the *Provincial Offences Act*.

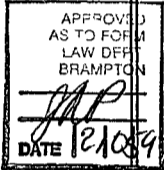
