BY-LAW

Number 156-93

To Amend Development Charges
By-law No. 234-91 (Brampton Hydro)

WHEREAS By-law No. 234-91, passed the 28th day of October, 1991 pursuant to the provisions of the Development Charges Act, R.S.O. 1990, C.D9 (the "Act"), imposed development charges for hydro electrical services by Brampton Hydro on all residential and non-residential land uses;

AND WHEREAS Brampton Hydro, as an interim measure to encourage economic development in the City, has requested the Council to amend By-law No. 234-91 to reduce the amount of the development charges for non-residential uses for the period from January 1, 1992 to December 31, 1995;

AND WHEREAS the Council gave notice to the public and held a public meeting pursuant to section 4 of the Act on the 16th day of August, 1993 prior to and at which sufficient information was made available to the public and the Council heard comments and representations from all persons who applied to be heard.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

1. Schedule C of By-law No. 234-91, entitled "Interim Calculations, Payment, and Collection of Non-residential Development Charges" is amended by adding thereto the following section 3:

"3.

- 3.1 From the 1st day of January, 1992 to and including the 31st day of December, 1995, the base rates (as of October 28, 1991) for the Brampton Hydro Development Charges, payable for non-residential uses (the Interim Charges) shall be as follows:

January 1, 1992	\$2,570 at 600 volts, per 100 A of service capacity \$ 890 at 208 volts, per 100 A of service capacity
January 1, 1993	\$2,855 at 600 volts, per 100 A of service capacity \$ 990 at 208 volts, per 100 A of service capacity
January 1, 1994	\$3,140 at 600 volts, per 100 A of service capacity \$1,090 at 208 volts, per 100 A of service capacity
January 1, 1995	\$3,425 at 600 volts, per 100 A of service capacity \$1,190 at 208 volts, per 100 A of service capacity


3.2 Section 9 of this By-law shall apply to the Interim Charges.


3.3 From and after the 1st day of January, 1996, the Development Charge for any non-residential use shall be as set out in Schedule B."


2. This By-law comes into force and takes effect on the 16th day of August, 1993.

DECLARATION


I, KATHRYN ZAMMIT, of the City of Brampton, in the
