



THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON

BY-LAW

Number 195-84

To amend By-laws 825, 861 and 5500
(parking of trailers and large
vehicles), and to repeal and replace
By-law 284-80

The Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton
ENACTS as FOLLOWS:

1. By-law 825, as amended, of the former Township of Toronto Gore, is hereby further amended by adding to SECTION V - GENERAL PROVISIONS the following subsection:

"(5) PARKING OF TRAILERS AND LARGE VEHICLES

- (1) For the purposes of this subsection,

CATERING TRUCK shall mean a truck cab and frame with a catering box installed thereon, having a vehicle weight not in excess of 3300 kilograms, from which various beverages, foods and sundries are sold at various locations.

LARGE MOTOR VEHICLE shall mean any motor vehicle having a vehicle weight greater than 2500 kilograms,

MOTOR VEHICLE includes an automobile, truck, bus, self-propelled mobile home, motorcycle, motor-assisted bicycle, snowmobile, and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power, and

VEHICLE WEIGHT shall mean the weight of the vehicle itself, as set out in the manufacturer's specifications.

- (2) A person shall not park or store, or permit to be parked or stored, on any lot the use of which is restricted to residential purposes, any large motor vehicle other than a catering truck, unless it is at the time being used to make a delivery or to provide a service.
- (3) Except as permitted by paragraph 4 of this subsection, a person shall not park or store, or permit to be parked or stored, any truck trailer, mobile home, house trailer, travel trailer, or any other type of trailer, in the front yard, including the part of the driveway therein, of any lot the use of which is restricted to residential purposes.

(4) A travel trailer not exceeding 5 metres in length when closed may be parked or stored in the part of the driveway that is in the front yard."

2. By-law 861, as amended, of the former Township of Chinguacousy, is hereby further amended by adding to section 12 (GENERAL PROVISIONS) the following subsection:

"(7) PARKING OF TRAILERS AND LARGE VEHICLES

- (1) For the purposes of this subsection,

CATERING TRUCK shall mean a truck cab and frame with a catering box installed thereon, having a vehicle weight not in excess of 3300 kilograms, from which various beverages, foods and sundries are sold at various locations.

LARGE MOTOR VEHICLE shall mean any motor vehicle having a vehicle weight greater than 2500 kilograms,

MOTOR VEHICLE includes an automobile, truck, bus, self-propelled mobile home, motorcycle, motor-assisted bicycle, snowmobile, and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power, and

VEHICLE WEIGHT shall mean the weight of the vehicle itself, as set out in the manufacturer's specifications.

- (2) A person shall not park or store, or permit to be parked or stored, on any lot the use of which is restricted to residential purposes, any large motor vehicle other than a catering truck, unless it is at the time being used to make a delivery or to provide a service.
- (3) Except as permitted by paragraph 4 of this subsection, a person shall not park or store, or permit to be parked or stored, any truck trailer, mobile home, house trailer, travel trailer, or any other type of trailer, in the front yard, including the part of the driveway therein, of any lot the use of which is restricted to residential purposes.
- (4) A travel trailer not exceeding 5 metres in length when closed may be parked or stored in the part of the driveway that is in the front yard."

3. By-law 5500, as amended, of the former Town of Mississauga, is hereby further amended by deleting therefrom section 37 (PARKING OF COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES IN RESIDENTIAL ZONES), and substituting therefor the following:

"37. PARKING OF TRAILERS AND LARGE VEHICLES

- (1) For the purposes of this section,

CATERING TRUCK shall mean a truck cab and frame with a catering box installed thereon, having a vehicle weight not in excess of 3300 kilograms, from which various beverages, foods and sundries are sold at various locations.

LARGE MOTOR VEHICLE shall mean any motor vehicle having a vehicle weight greater than 2500 kilograms,


MOTOR VEHICLE includes an automobile, truck, bus, self-propelled mobile home, motorcycle, motor-assisted bicycle, snowmobile, and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power, and


VEHICLE WEIGHT shall mean the weight of the vehicle itself, as set out in the manufacturer's specifications.

- (2) A person shall not park or store, or permit to be parked or stored, on any lot the use of which is restricted to residential purposes, any large motor vehicle other than a catering truck, unless it is at the time being used to make a delivery or to provide a service.
- (3) Except as permitted by subsection 4, a person shall not park or store, or permit to be parked or stored, any truck trailer, mobile home, house trailer, travel trailer, or any other type of trailer, in the front yard, including the part of the driveway therein, of any lot the use of which is restricted to residential purposes.
- (4) A travel trailer not exceeding 5 metres in length when closed may be parked or stored in the part of the driveway that is in the front yard.

4. By-law 284-80 is hereby repealed.
