

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON

BY-LAW

Number _____ 219-76

Being a by-law to expropriate certain lands in the City of Brampton

WHEREAS the Corporation of the City of Brampton, as Expropriating Authority, on the 20th day of September 1976, passed By-law Number 200-76 authorizing the expropriation of the lands shown on Schedule "A" attached hereto and, further, authorizing the Clerk to sign notices and advertisements on behalf of the Corporation of the City of Brampton as required by The Expropriations Act, R.S.O. 1970, Chapter 154, and amendments thereto;

AND WHEREAS the Clerk, on the 21st day of September 1976, served by prepaid registered mail a notice of its application for approval to expropriate upon each registered owner of the lands to be expropriated, and caused the same to be published on the 23rd and 30th days of September 1976 and the 7th day of October 1976 respectively in the Brampton Daily Times and the Guardian, being newspapers having general circulation in the locality in which the lands as shown on Schedule "A" attached hereto are situate;

AND WHEREAS the Clerk has not received notice from any owner desiring a hearing as to whether the expropriation is fair, sound and reasonably necessary; .

AND WHEREAS the Corporation of the City of Brampton, in its capacity as Expropriating Authority, doth hereby apply to the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton, in its capacity as an Approving Authority, to obtain approval to expropriate the lands described in Schedule "A" attached hereto; AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton, in its capacity as an Approving Authority, has considered the application of the Corporation of the City of Brampton to expropriate lands as described in Schedule "A" attached hereto and finds that the application is fair, sound and reasonably necessary;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

(1) the expropriation of the lands described in Schedule "A" is hereby approved by the Council of the City of Brampton;

(2) the lands described in Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this by-law are hereby expropriated for public purposes.

READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD TIME and PASSED in Open Council this **25th** day of **October**, 1976.

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SCHEDULE "A

FIRSTLY, being composed of part of Lot 4, according to a plan registered in the Registry Office of the Registry Division of Peel (No. 43) as Plan 601, and being more particularly described as Part 19 according to a plan deposited in the said Registry Office as Plan Number 43R-2523;

SECONDLY, being composed of part of Lot 4, according to a plan registered in the Registry Office of the Registry Division of Peel (No. 43) as Plan 601, and being more particularly described as Part 20 according to a plan deposited in the said Registry Office as Plan Number 43R-2523;

THIRDLY, being composed of part of Lot 1, according to a plan registered in the Registry Office of the Registry Division of Peel (No. 43) as Plan 601, and being more particularly described as Part 24 according to a plan deposited in the said Registry Office as Plan Number 43R-2523; and

FOURTHLY, being composed of part of Lot 7, Concession 1, East of Hurontario Street, in the City of Brampton, in the Regional Municipality of Peel, formerly in the Township of Chinguacousy, in the County of Peel, and being more particularly described as Part 25 according to a plan deposited in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of Peel (No. 43) as Plan Number 43R-2523.
