An interim control by-law applicable to part of the area subject to By-law 200-82 (former Town of Brampton Comprehensive Zoning By-law)

The council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

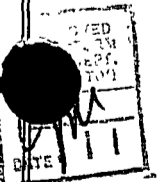
1. The lands shown outlined as the "Subject Lands" on Schedule A to this by-law shall not be used for a residential dwelling which has a gross floor area in excess of 278.7 square metres, or a building height in excess of 9.0 metres.
2. This by-law shall be in effect from 11 December, 1989 until 12 June, 1990.

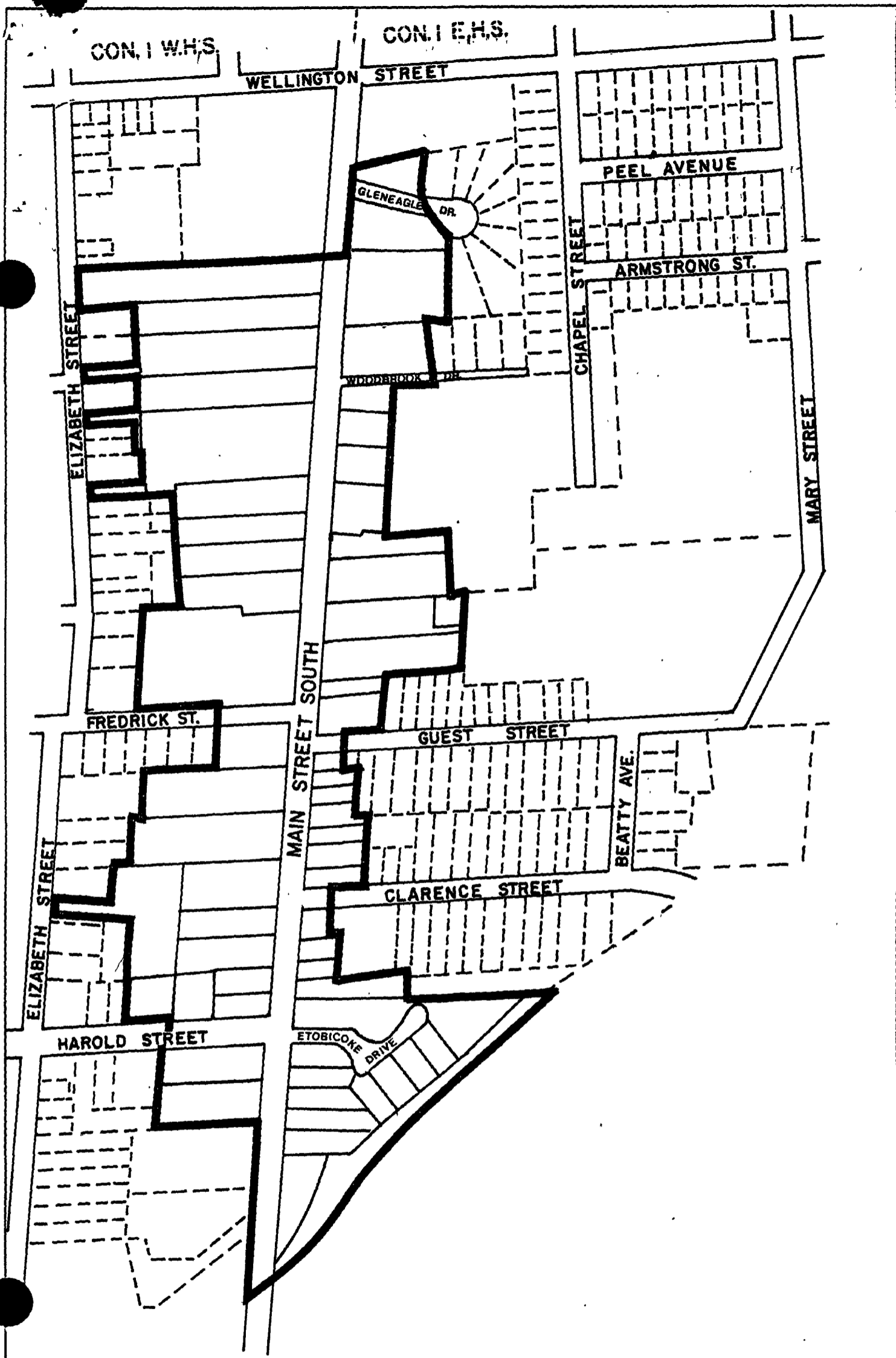
READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD TIME, and PASSED, in OPEN COUNCIL, this 11th day of December 1989.
